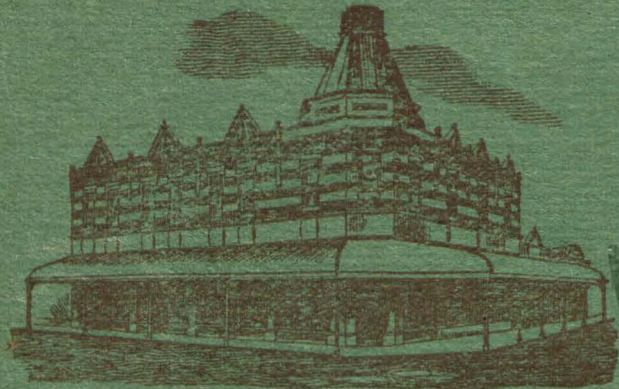

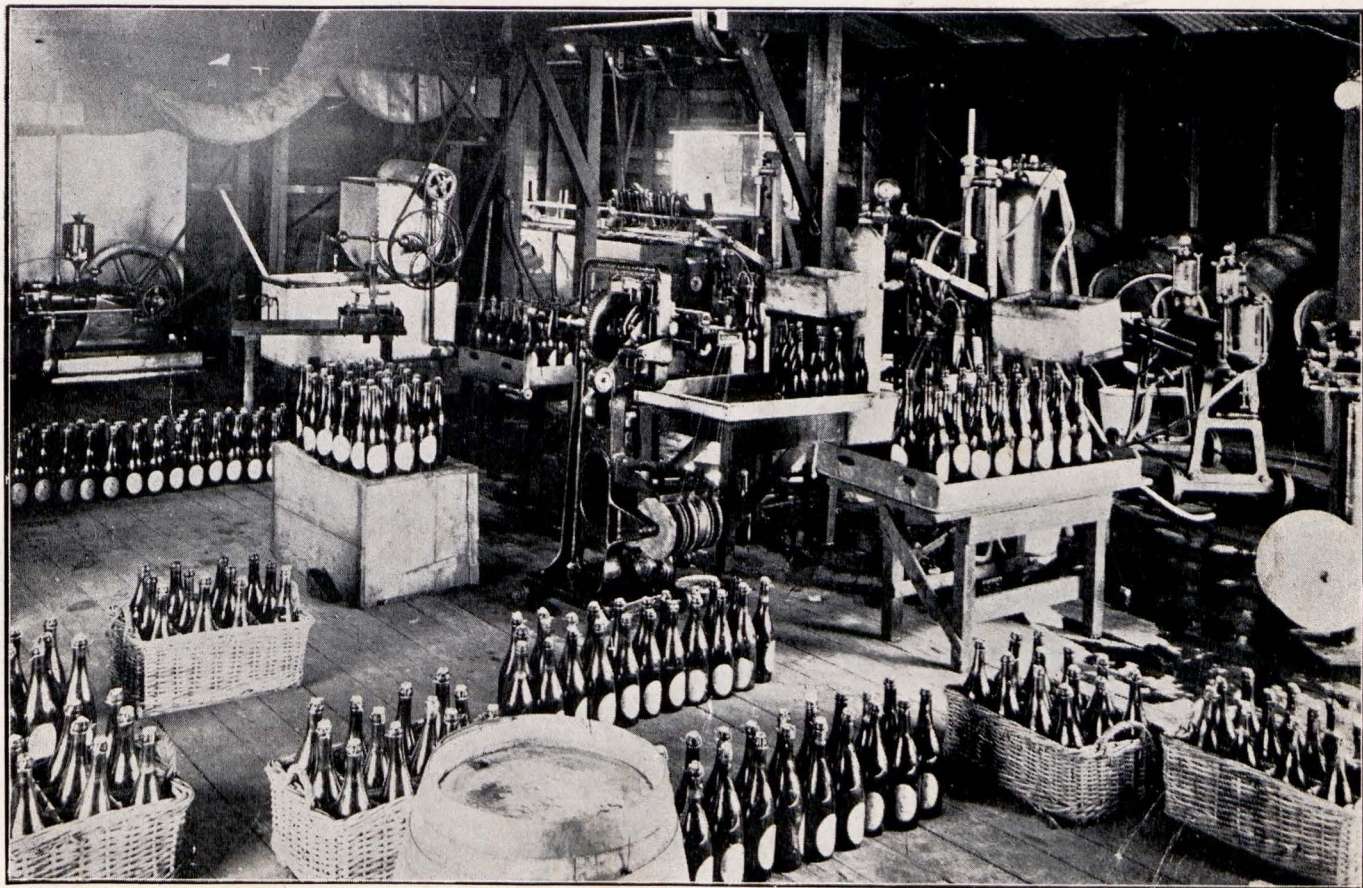

pastoral country, while mineral lands of considerable area stretch to the back, the extensive Collie coalfields being only forty-two miles distant, while gold has been found at Donnybrook, and tin at Greenbushes. Of recent years, fruit-growing has attracted the attention of expert orchardists, and

within easy reach of the town are to be found some of the best cultivated orchards in the State. In the near future, fruit will undoubtedly be exported in large quantities from Bunbury. The

town is connected by rail with Perth, and has sea communication with Fremantle. It has also railway communication daily with Collie, Busselton, Donnybrook, and Bridgetown.

Bunbury is a busy, prosperous-looking town, with most of the ordinary conveniences appertaining to a well-governed seaport. It contains a population of 3,000 persons, and is under municipal government, the members of the Town Council being his Worship the Mayor (Mr N. J. Moore, M.L.A.), Crs K. M. Eastman, A. F. 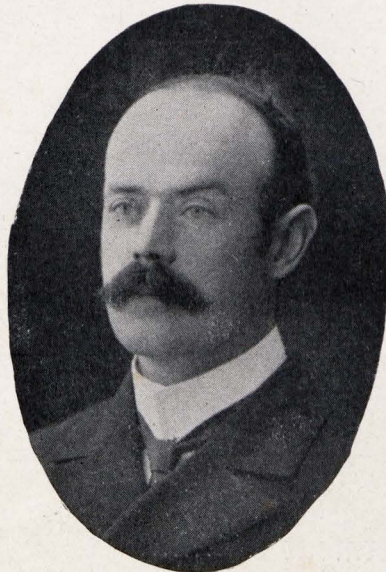

J. B. Witton, C. Egglestone and G. R. Teede. Within the municipality are seventeen miles of streets, mostly in excellent order, and well formed and drained. The total annual value of ratable property is set down at £23,000 and the rates total over £13,000 per annum. The Municipal Council buildings are neat in outward appearance,

while internally they are commodious and comfortable. Attached to the official rooms is the municipal library and free reading-room (an exceedingly attractive feature of the town), which is well

patronised by the residents and by visitors.

The public buildings of Bunbury can easily be counted on the fingers on one hand, and it is clear that the charge so often made of Government money being

wasted on Bunbury has no foundation in fact. The courthouse is a relic of the early days of the State, and its dismal appearance is accentuated by the gloomy lock-up which it barely hides. The State hospital is a roomy, well-built, brick edifice, standing in its own grounds, and occupying a commanding position at the head of the main street. This institution is in reality a district institution, as patients from all parts of the South-west

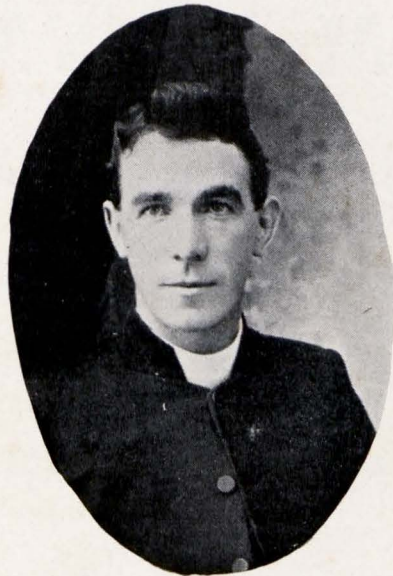

seek admission. Dr. D. E. Williams is the efficient medical superintendent, and he has under his control a staff of qualified nurses. The State School is centrally situated, the average daily attendance of scholars numbering 365. Mr. T. W. Paisley, the head teacher, has a good

body of qualified teachers under his control. The post office, with which are associated the telegraph, savings bank, and telephone offices, is a fairly presentable pile of bricks, with little striking or

uncommon in outward appearance. Mr. E. Woodrow has been in command for twenty-five years. The Custom house is the only other public building, and it is merely a small unassuming brick struc-

ture, which has to be carefully sought for before it can be found.

Of semi-public and private buildings, the most pretentious structure in Bunbury is the convent school, a handsome carefully-planned erection, just off the main street. The English Church is a quaint, old-fashioned building, standing in a grassy plot and relieved with trees, shrubs and flowers. It occupies one of

the best corners in the main street, and adjoins the post office. The church has now been raised to the Episcopal dignity of being a pro-Cathedral, as in July last Dean Goldsmith, of Perth, was created Bishop of Bunbury. Quite recently his Lordship and Mrs. Goldsmith took up their residence in the town, and plans

are being prepared having for their object the erection of a fitting residence for the Bishop, and also for the construction of a Cathedral. The Congregational Church (Rev. J. Chapman) is a substan-

tial structure, with a heavy tower surmounting it, while internally it is the most comfortable church in the town. Of simple architectural design is the

brick Wesleyan Church (Rev. A. Bray), which occupies an elevated position on a small sand hill. The Roman Catholics (Revs. Father Martelli and Father Kiely) are sadly in want of a new church and a new presbytery. The Salvation Army has a wooden "barracks" near the State school. Among the most striking buildings in the town are the hotels, the "Rose," the "Burlington," and the "Gordon's," being substantial



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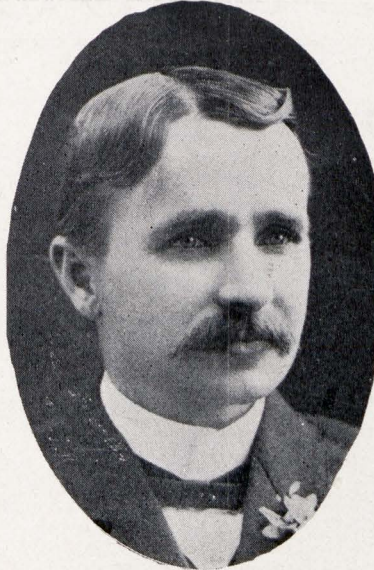

and ornate enough for any city; the "Wellington," and the "Prince of Wales," comfortable hostelrys; the "Parade," and the "Federal" (South Bunbury), brick structures fitted with the ordinary up-to-date hotel conveniences. The Bank of Western Australia is a pleasant-looking two-storey building, occupying one of the most central sites in

the town. The Union Bank and the Bank of Australia are situate in the main street. Most of the business premises speak eloquently as to the soundness of the trade of Bunbury, being of solid

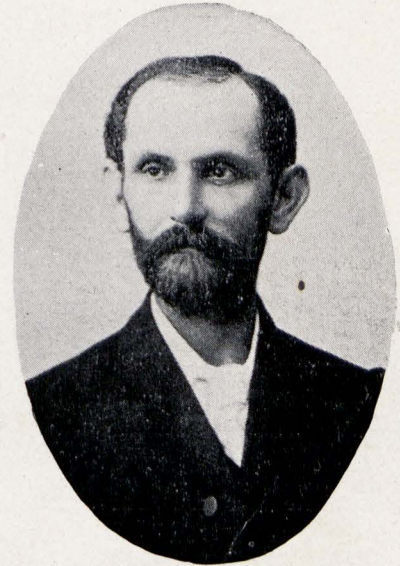

which greatly adds to the architectural grace of the main street. Numerous villas are also in course of erection in various parts of the town and suburbs. Messrs. Weiss Bros., with commendable enterprise, have recently let a contract for the erection of a theatre, at a cost of £3,500. The building is now in course of erection, and should be completed by the end of February next.

The town is lit with electricity. For its size Bunbury is probably the best lit town in the State. The plant was erected

by Messrs. Splatt, Wall and Co. It has been erected in a suitable house, and consists of two 35 h.p. Paxman's patent economic boilers. Over sixteen miles of cables are in use for the town supply. The streets are lighted by means of six Crompton arc lamps of 1,500 c.p., and fifty-three incandescent lamps of 32 c.p. each. The telephone service is now in full operation, having been fitted to most of the business premises.

The climate of Bunbury is of the most equable character, and cannot be surpassed in any part of the State. There are no extremes, and in the summer no pleasanter place in which to reside can well be

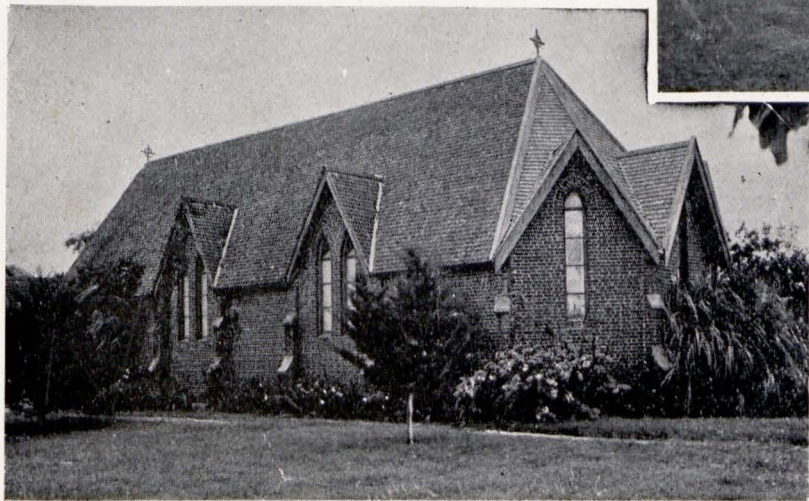

imagined. The thermometer rarely rises above 80 degrees and seldom falls below 65 degrees, and the nights are invariably rendered cool by the soft sea breeze. Rain falls in the winter months, commencing about the latter end of May and continuing until the end of September. In summer, the days are dry and brilliant, and rain is the exception. The average fall of rain for the year is thirty-three inches. Droughts and floods are absolutely unknown in the South-West district.

To the visitor, Bunbury offers many advantages. Built, as it principally is, on a peninsula, the waters of the Indian Ocean wash its shores on each side of the town. On the main, erroneously termed

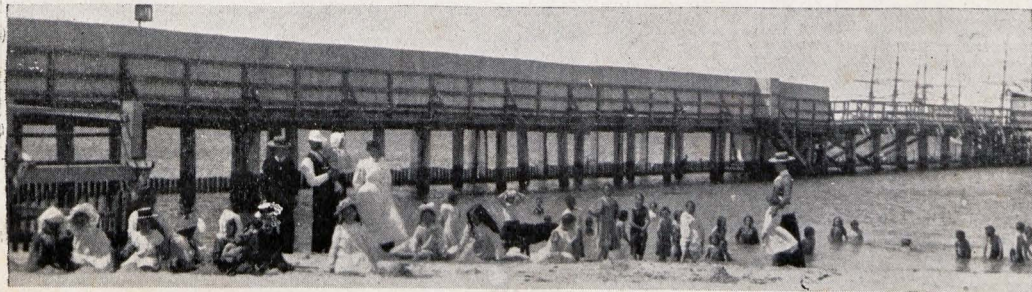

the "back" beach, the play of the white-crested waves may be watched for hours, "the long wash on the Australasian shore" being clearly noticeable. On this beach one may ride or walk with pleasure, and the rocks, the gorge, and the miniature caves are delightful little spots, either for sketching, or for an hour or two of lazy satisfying pleasure. Seats

have been provided at many points, but the soft creamy sand is usually preferred. On a rough day the view at the rocks, or at the gorge, is entrancing. For miles along the beach, the huge waves can be seen breaking on the shore, sending the glistening white spray several feet into the air, while the beach is covered with long lines of wind-driven froth. The estuary presents an extensive and lovely view, from the harbour dotted with ships, to the hazy outline of the Darling Ranges in the far distance. The long protecting arm of the breakwater marks a black rampart of stone, which serves to partly keep the occasionally angry Indian Ocean in its place, or at least prevents it from working mischief on the ships in the harbour.

The estuary is like a glistening ribbon wound round foliaged shores, and as the waters attain to the higher reaches beyond the compass of the town they have cut out islands and sand-banks, and capes and bays where the wild-fowl are to be found, and where the salmon trout sports, and the bream chases the young mullet. . . 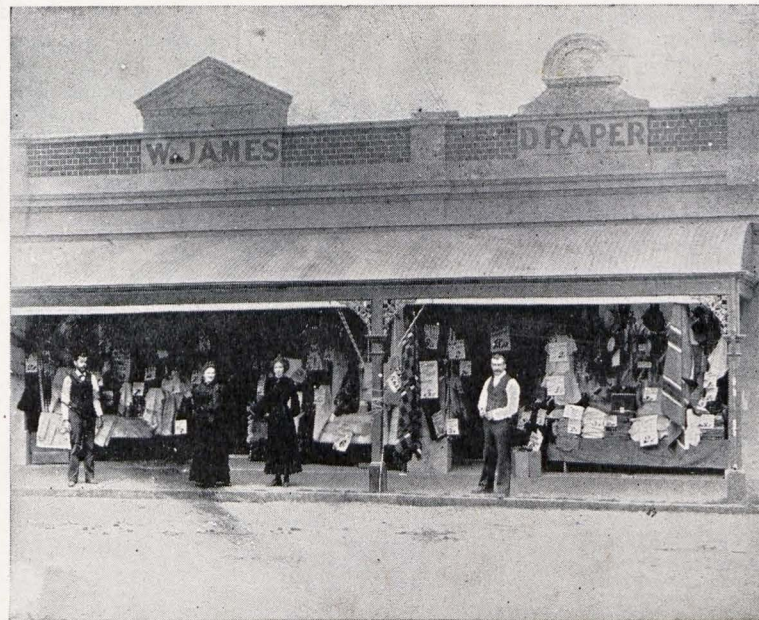

up the estuary, the ocean waters are met by the fresh waters of the Collie and the Preston rivers, and, after intermingling, they race back to the motherly embraces of the old, yet ever sweet and fresh, ocean. For those who do not care for the rough and tumble of the bay or the placidity of the estuary waters, there are scores of charming picnic spots within easy driving and cycling distance of the town. The military instinct is strong in the South-West District. In Bunbury there is the Bunbury Rifle Volunteers, commanded by Major Woodrow and Captain D. E. Williams. Connected with this company is a first-class band. The South-West Mounted Infantry, formed and commanded by Major Newton J. Moore, has its headquarters at Bunbury, with sections at Donnybrook, Boyanup, Capel, Busselton, Collie and Pinjarrah. Those with musical tastes will be pleased to know that Bunbury has an admirable Orchestral Society, which gives quarterly concerts of a superior character, while the recently formed Bunbury City Band, which frequently plays in the evening and on Sunday afternoons in the rotunda on the beach, is already an excellent combination of musicians, rapidly approaching the first-class. The band is under the control of Mr. Watson. The Bunbury Amateur Dramatic Society periodically present popular comedies, and on each occasion when they have done so in the past have been deservedly faced with large audiences.

The Bunbury harbour, or Koombana Bay, is now protected by 3,200 feet of breakwater, but affords inadequate shelter to the vessels which visit the port. Originally it was intended to carry out the breakwater to a distance of 6,000 feet. When this work is completed the Bunbury harbour should be the safest along the whole coast line of Western Australia, with the possible exception of King George's Sound. The expenditure is thoroughly justified, as the Bunbury harbour, after paying all working expenses, interest on capital and providing for the sinking fund, yields a substantial income to the Government, and one which is increasing year by year.

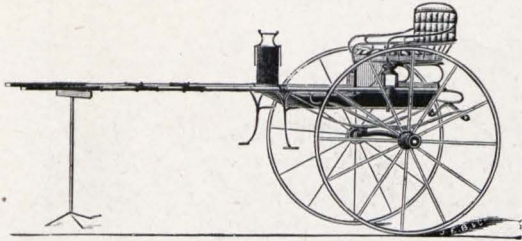


Victoria Street, Bunbury—Church Parade.
