in the mode of observing and calculating azimuths, amplitudes, and the  
variation of the Compass; in the calculation of the Tides, the various modes  
of ascertaining the Latitude as well by simple and double altitudes of the  
Sun as by the altitudes of the Moon and Stars; and the finding the Longitude  
by Chronometer and Lunar Observations; in all which subjects he has  
proved himself adequately qualified.
