

CLIPSES IN 1861.

In the year 1861, there will be three Eclipses of the Sun. one of the Moon, and a transit of Mercury over the Sun s dise

I. January 11 .- An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, central at noon about 800 miles East from King George's Sound. At Perth, the Eclipse will be almost total shortly before noon.

II. July 8.—An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, not visible to

the South of Sharks' Bay and Sydney.

III. December I7 .- A partial Eclipse of the Moon, to the extent of less than one-fifth of her diameter. Eclipse will begin on S.S.E. limb at 3h. 10m. p.m.; and end at 4h. 52m. on the S.W. by S. limb. Middle of the Eclipse at one minute past 4 o'clock.

IV. December 31 .- A total Eclipse of the Sun, visible only

in the Northern Hemisphere.

V. November 12.-A transit of Mercury over the Sun's disc. Ingress at Oh. 58m. p.m. Estess at 5h. 1m. p.m.



The system adopted in the Government Schools of this Colony corresponds in its main features with the national system of Ireland. Certain modifications however have been introduced with the view of meeting the special ro-

quirements and circumstances of the colony.

The primary object of the Government has been to secure, on the basis of religion, a sound and serviceable education for the children of the middle and lower classes, without any distinction of religious seet; and of which all can avail themselves without fear of interference with their religious convictions.

The proceedings of each day are commenced with general instruction from the Scripture Lesson Books, in which the Ministers of all religious denominations co-operating with the Board are invited to take part as often as they please, stipulating only that they abstain from alluding to those differences of opinion which unhappily divide the Christian

Church, but no children are required to attend without their parent's sanction.

Not less than five hours of every school day are devoted

to secular instruction

The General Board have expressed their willingness to facilitate to the utmost of their power any arrangements. Ministers of religion may wish to make for the special instruction of the children of their own denomination in the school room at any bour of the day, before or after the time set apart for general religious and secular instruction.

For the purpose of facilitating such special instruction, the Board are willing to supply Bibles on the application of

any Minister, co operating with the Board.

The increasing number of pupils attending the Government Schools affords every reason for supposing that the system meets with the general approval of the public.

ROMAN CATHOLIC SCHOOLS.




