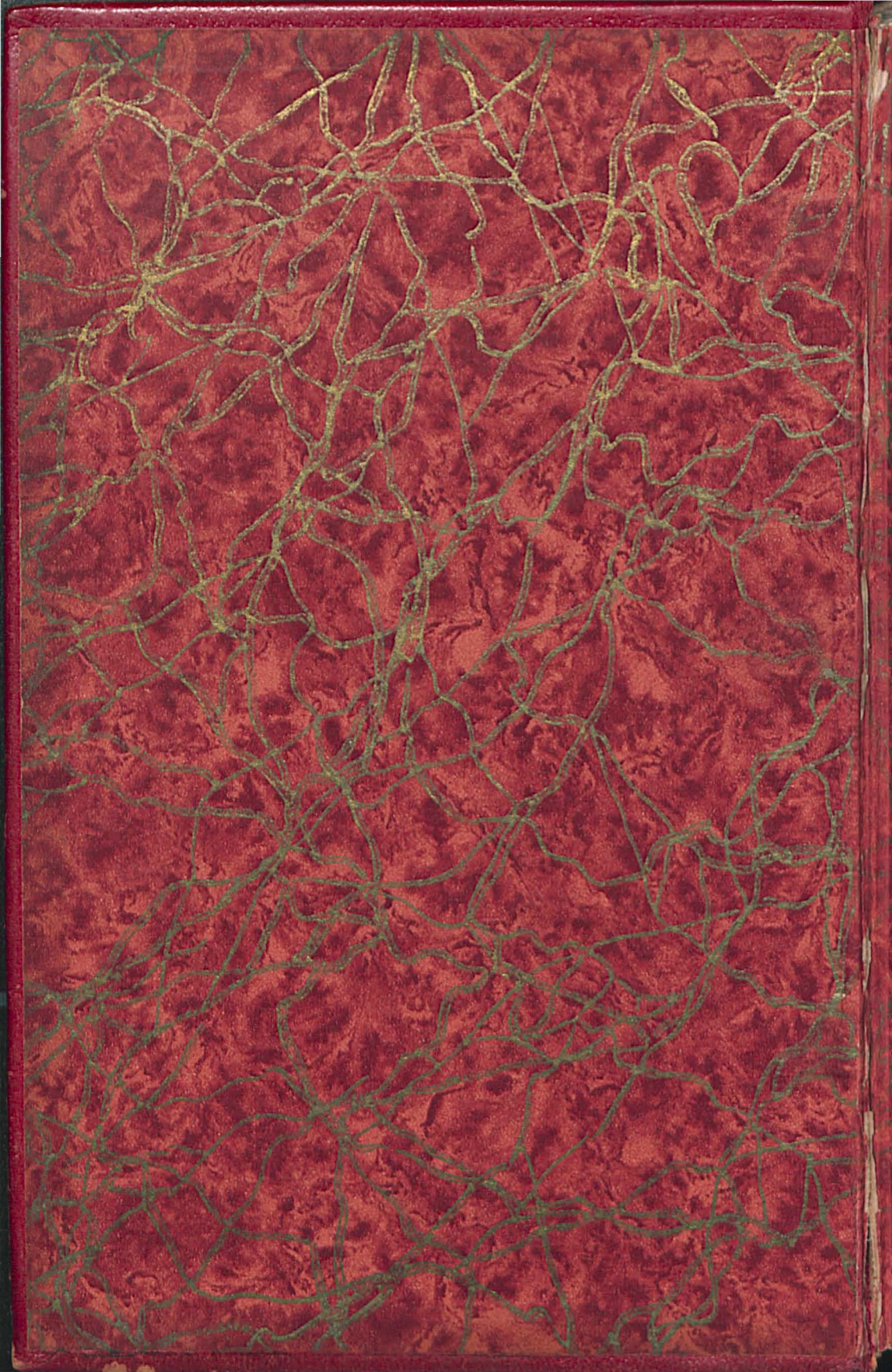
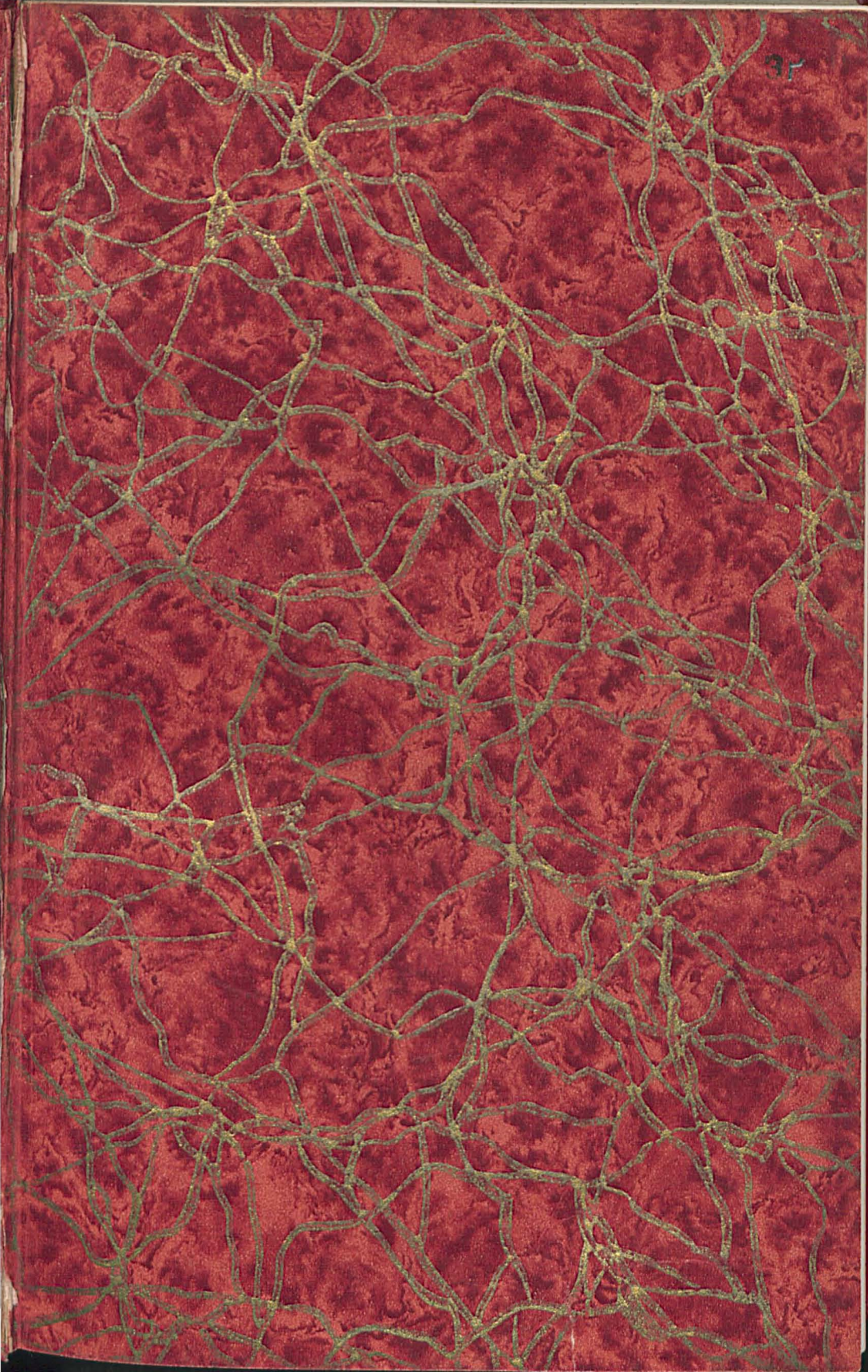

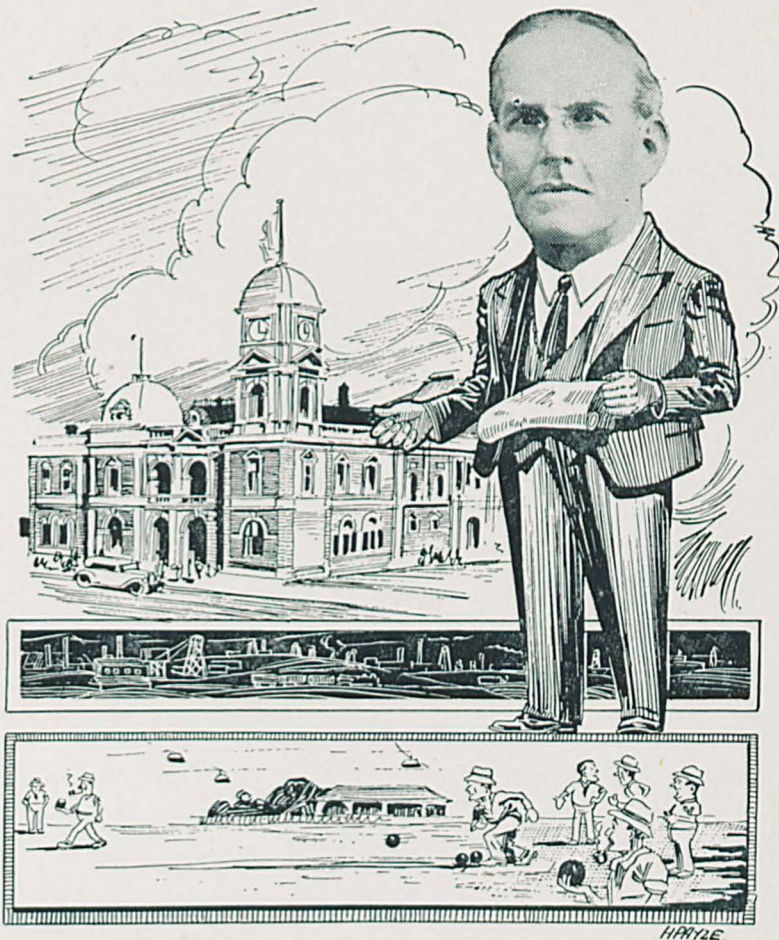

Districts Rifle Club Union. Interested in benevolent work.



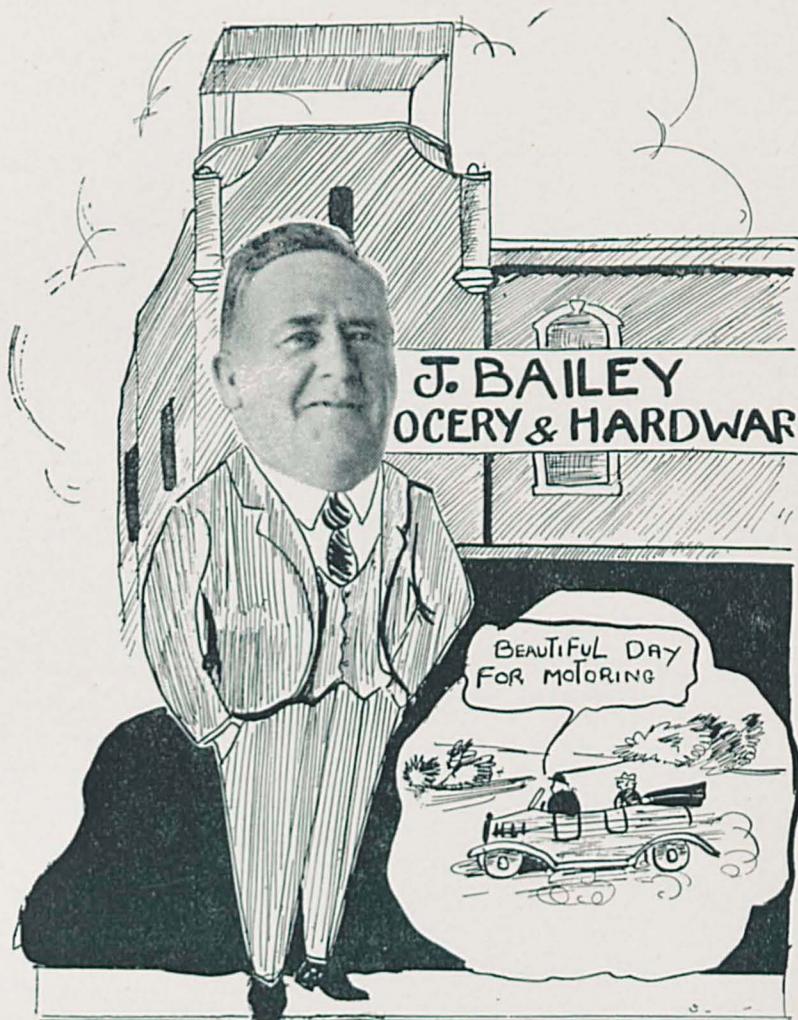
COATH, Walter Forrester

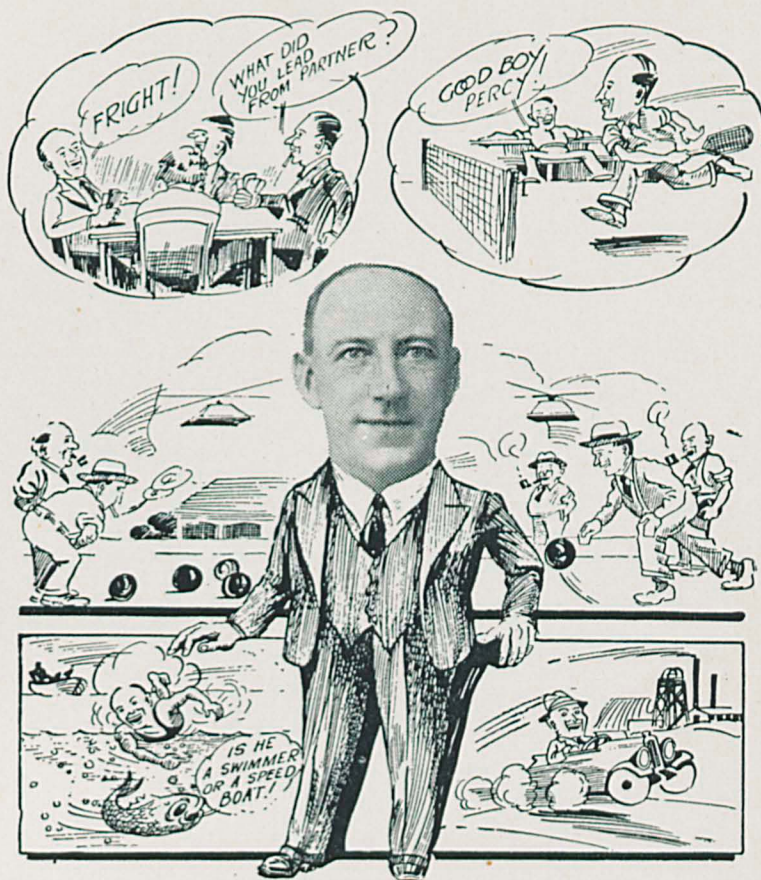
BAILEY, Councillor John, J.P.

movements.



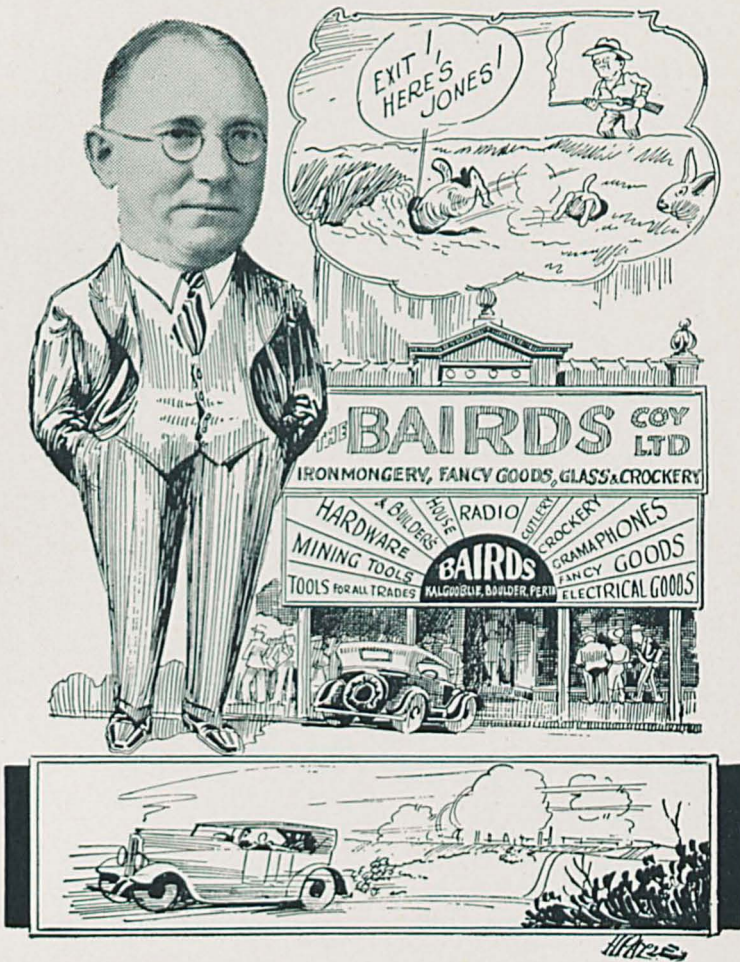
HUNT, Cr. Percy Campling

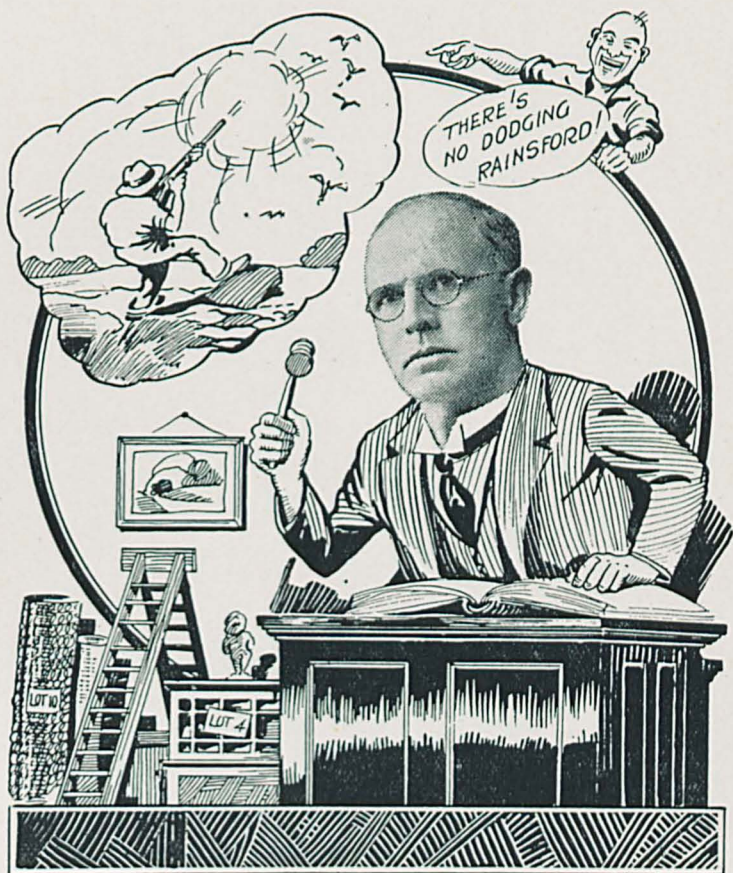
JONES, Cr. William Daniel

RAINSFORD, Cr. George Henry, J.P.

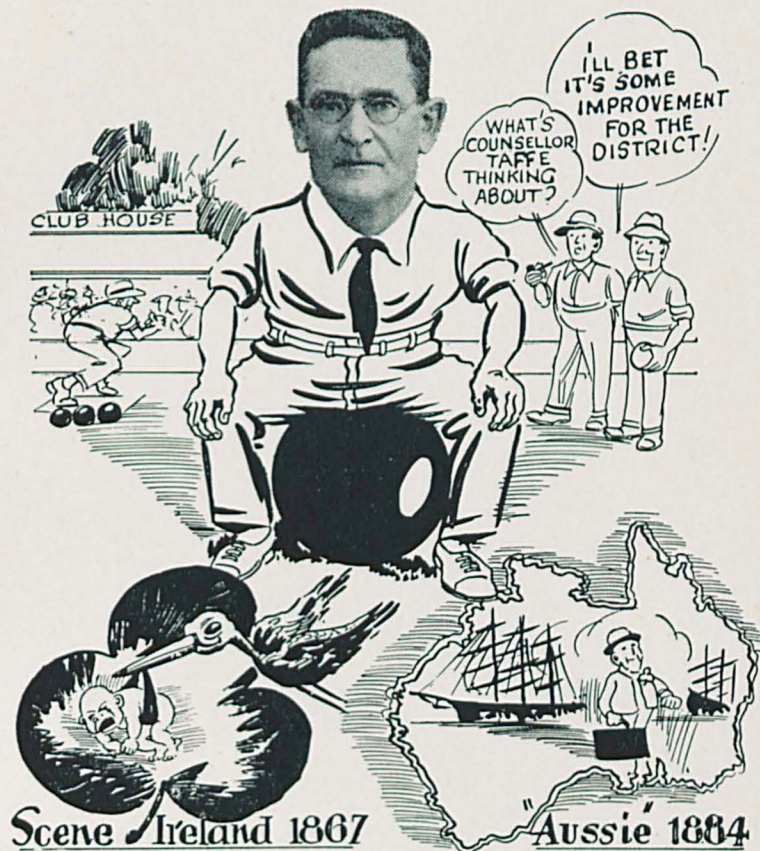
Auctioneer, House and Land and Insurance Agent and Sworn Valuator, Hannan Street, Kalgoorlie.

CROWE, William S.

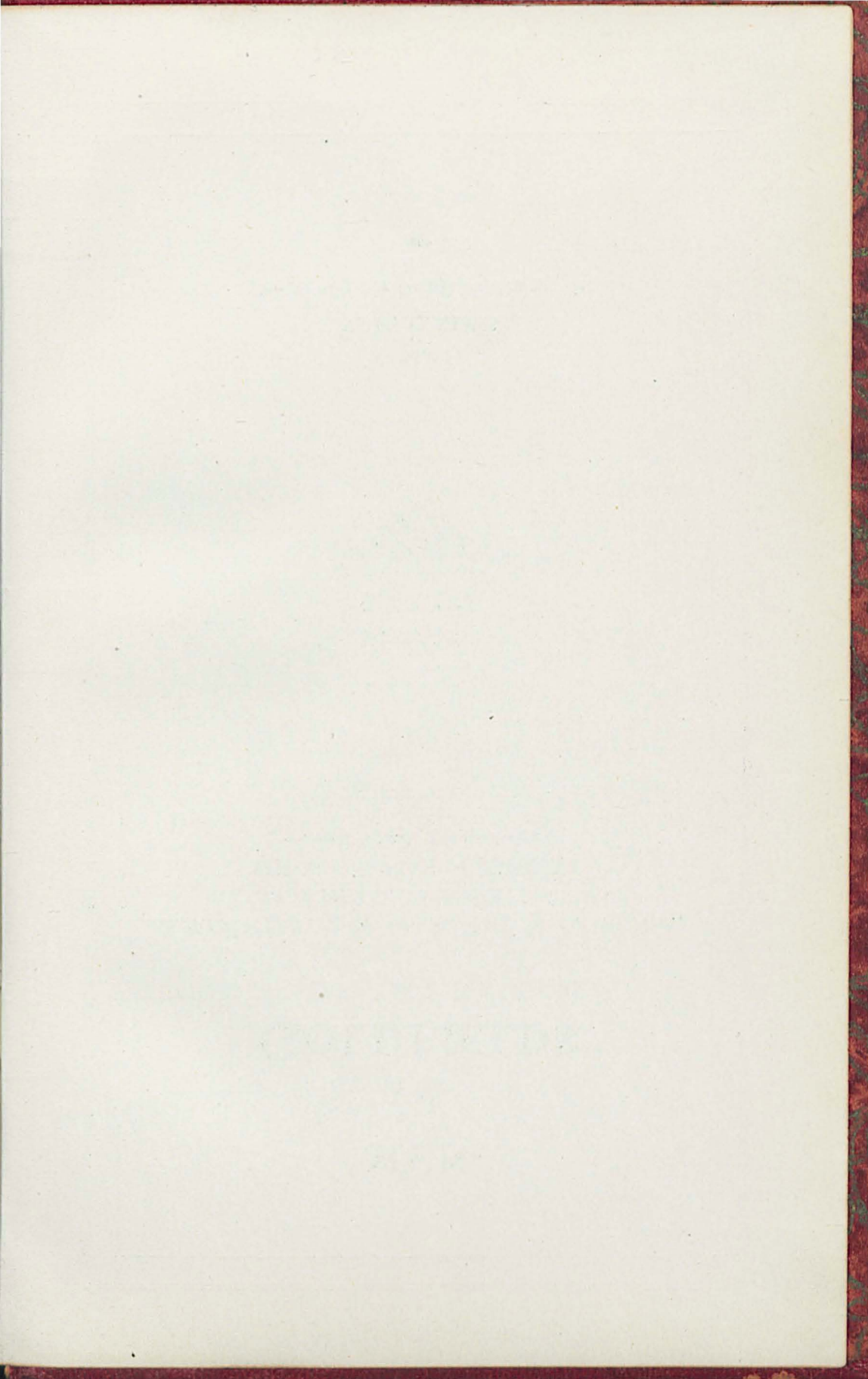

Educated St. Stanislaus' College, Bathurst, New South Wales.

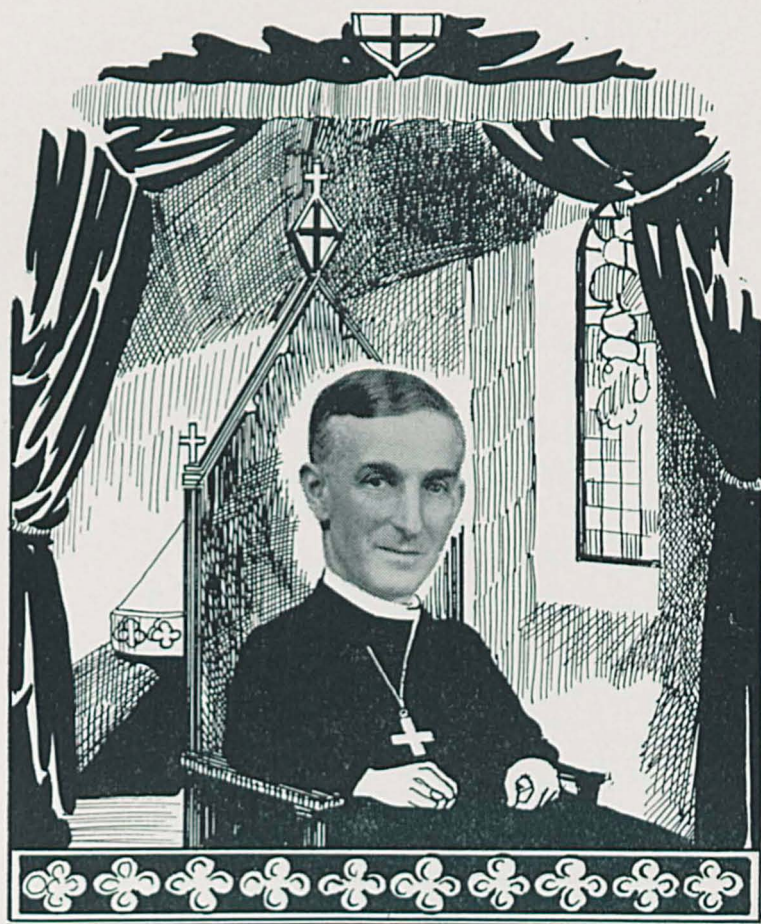

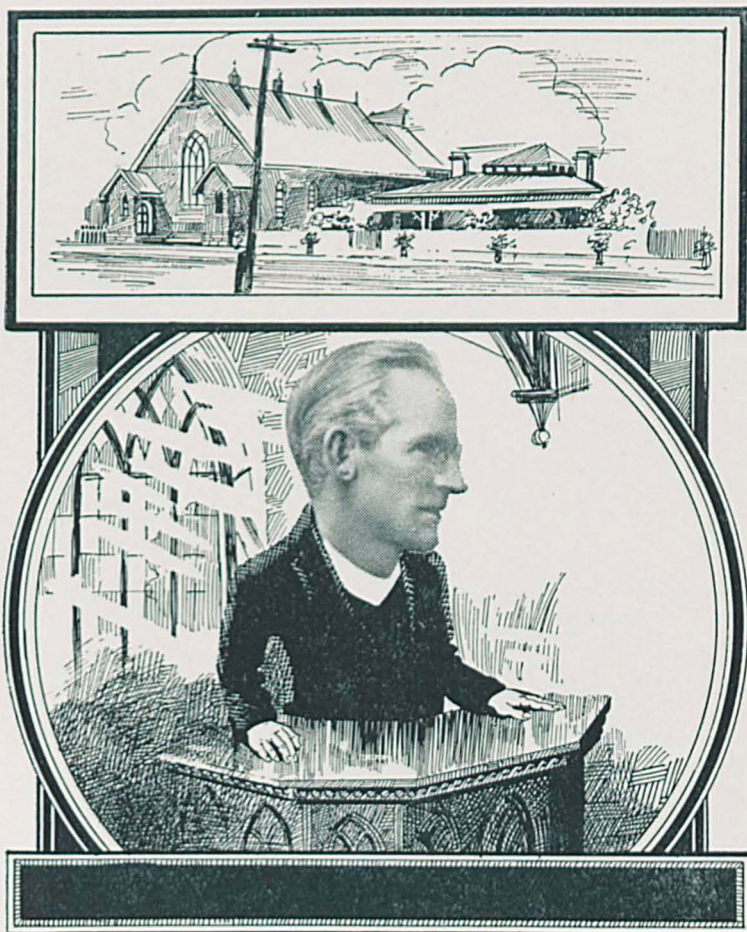


SULLIVAN, Rev. Edmund, D.P.H., D.D.

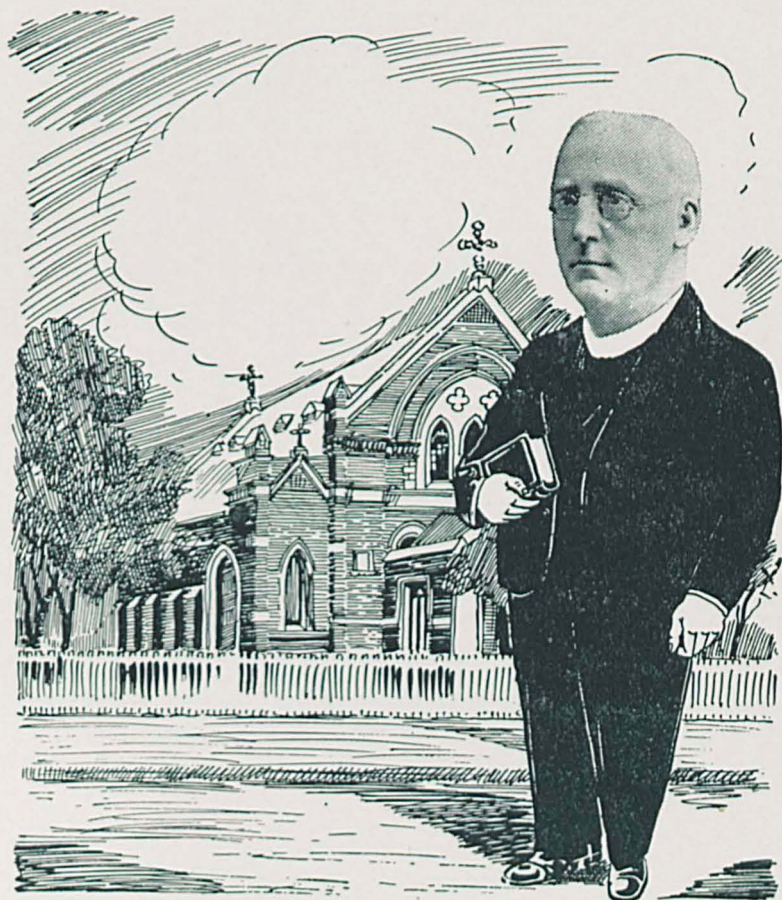


ANDREWS, Rev. James Albert Horace

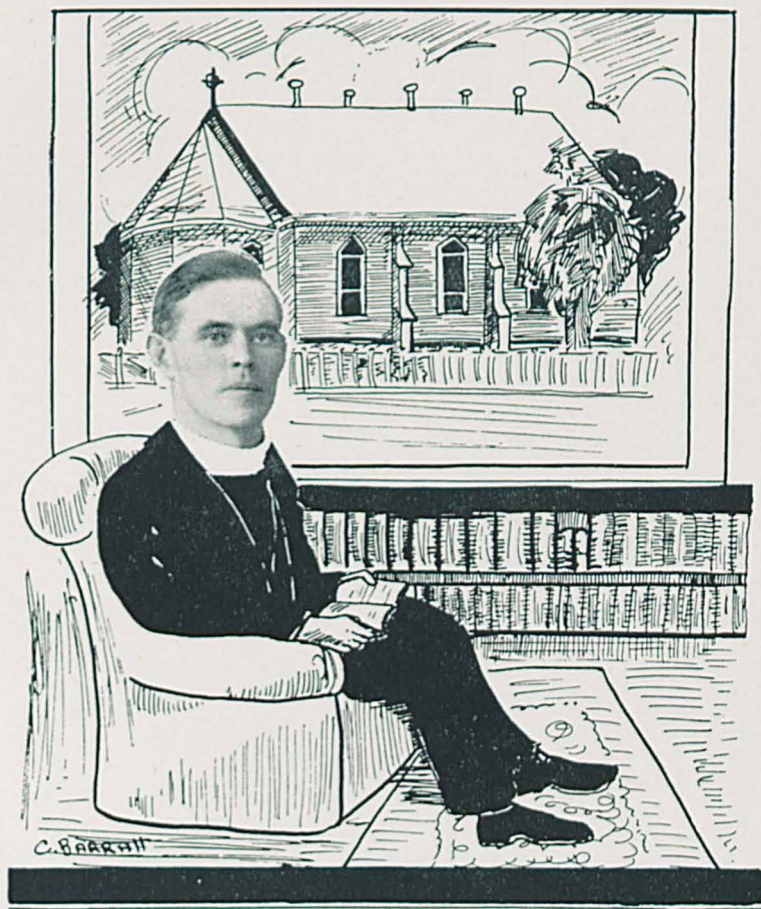

Was prominent as a soccer footballer, and played grade football with Manchester. Before coming to Australia was travelling Auditor for the Great Central Railway Company.



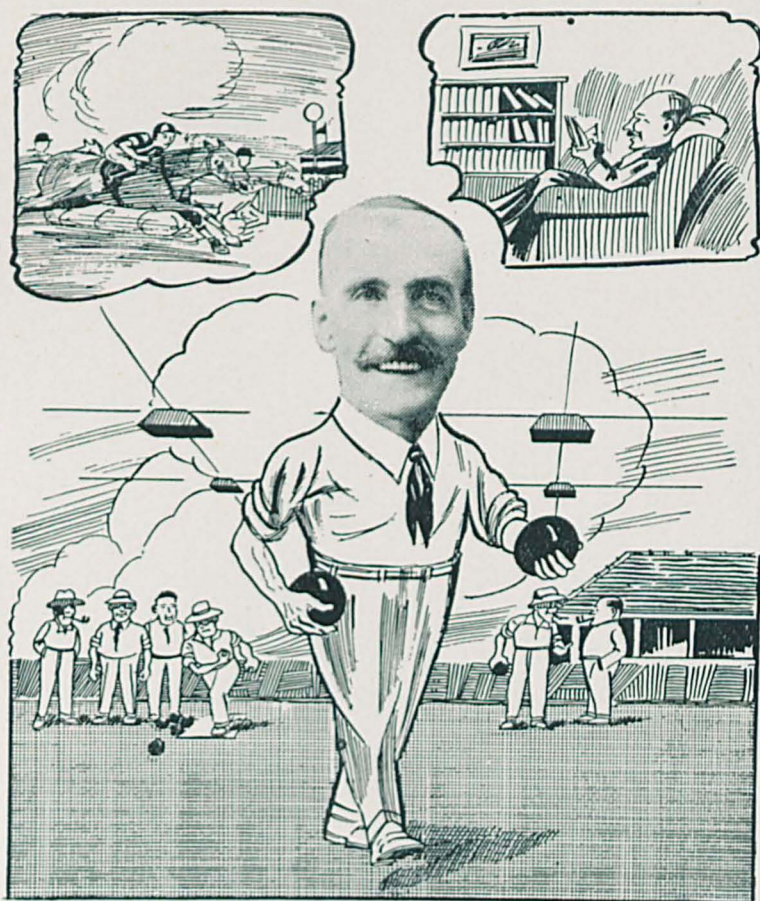
DALLY, George Herbert

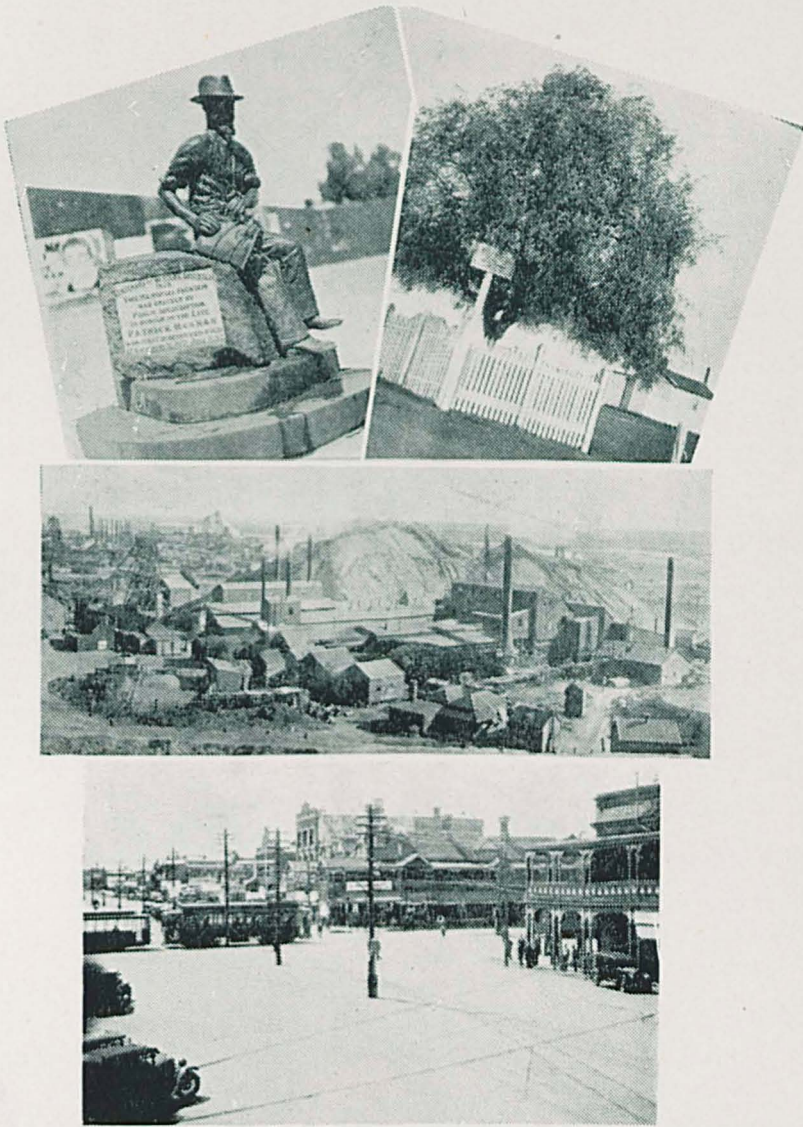


TREBY, Ernest John, L.I.C.A.

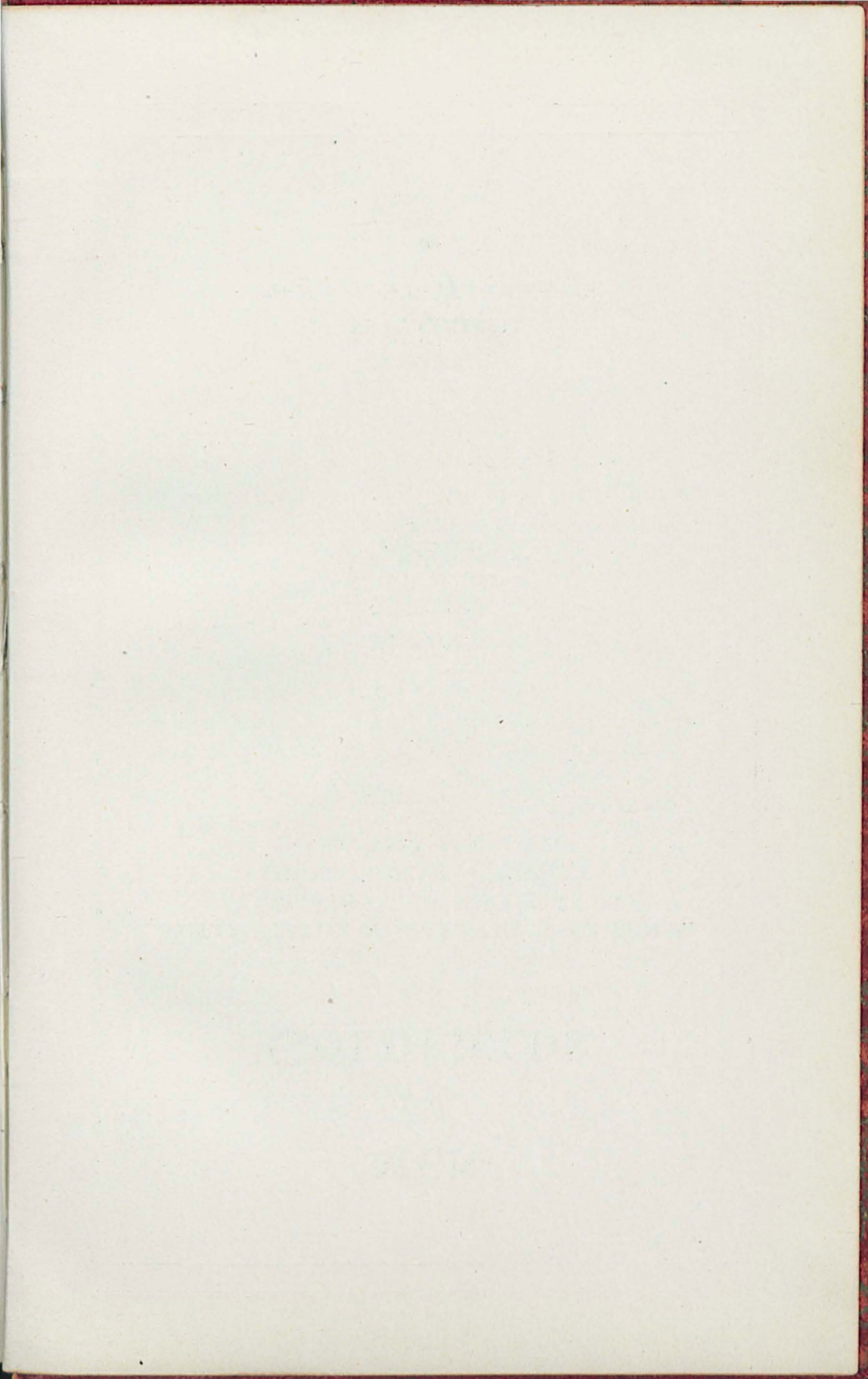


Top Left.—Memorial Fountain erected in honour of the late Patrick Hannan.

Top Right.—A Pepper Tree planted where Gold was first discovered on the Eastern Goldfields.

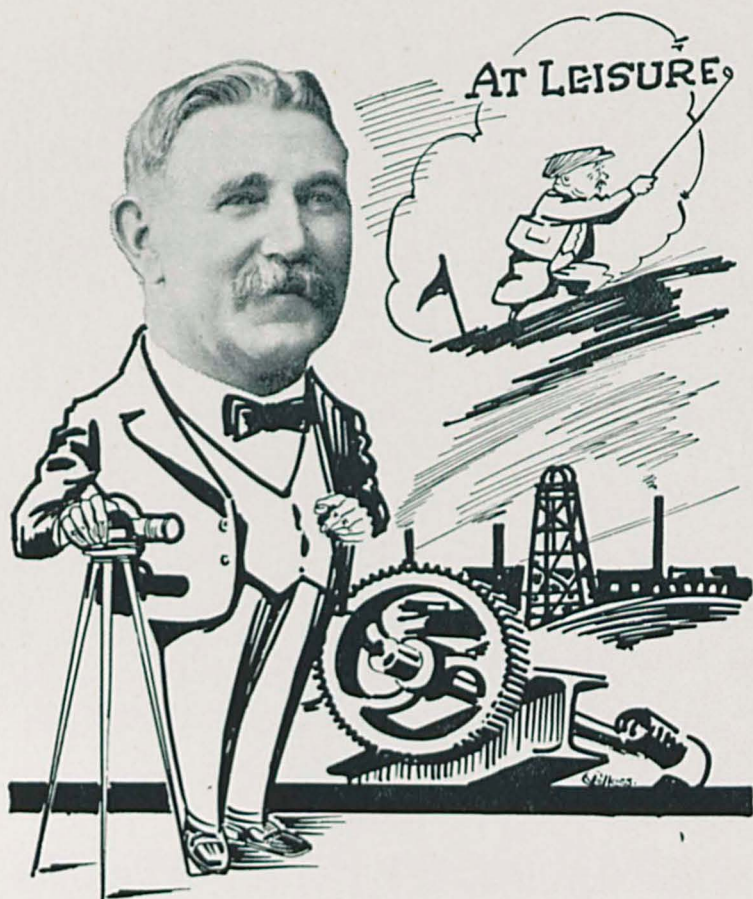
Centre.—General view of mining activities on the Golden Mile.

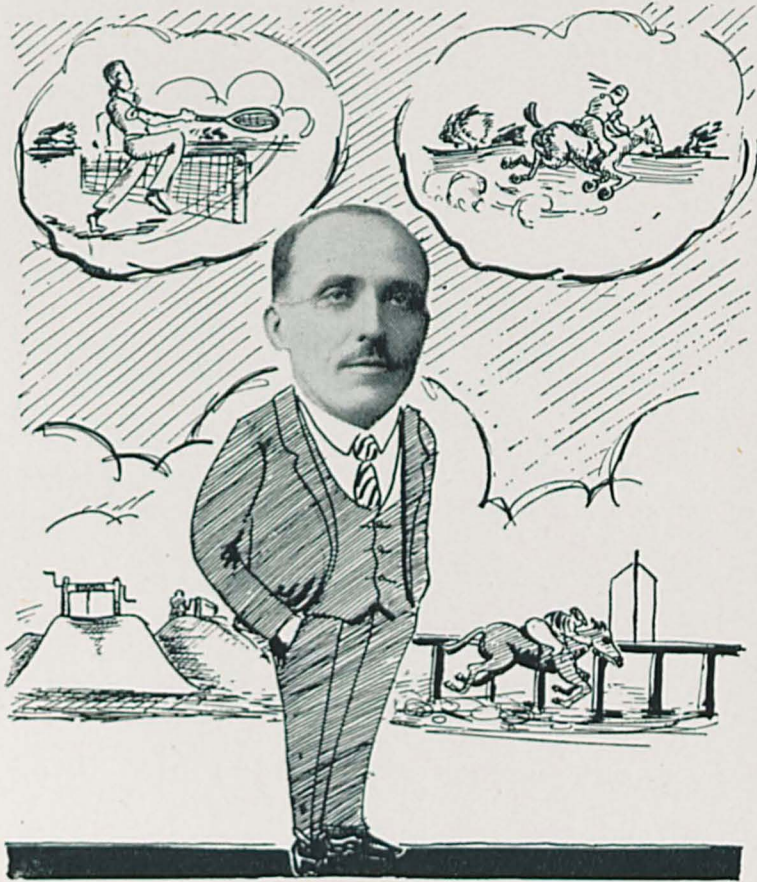




ALLEN, James Semmens

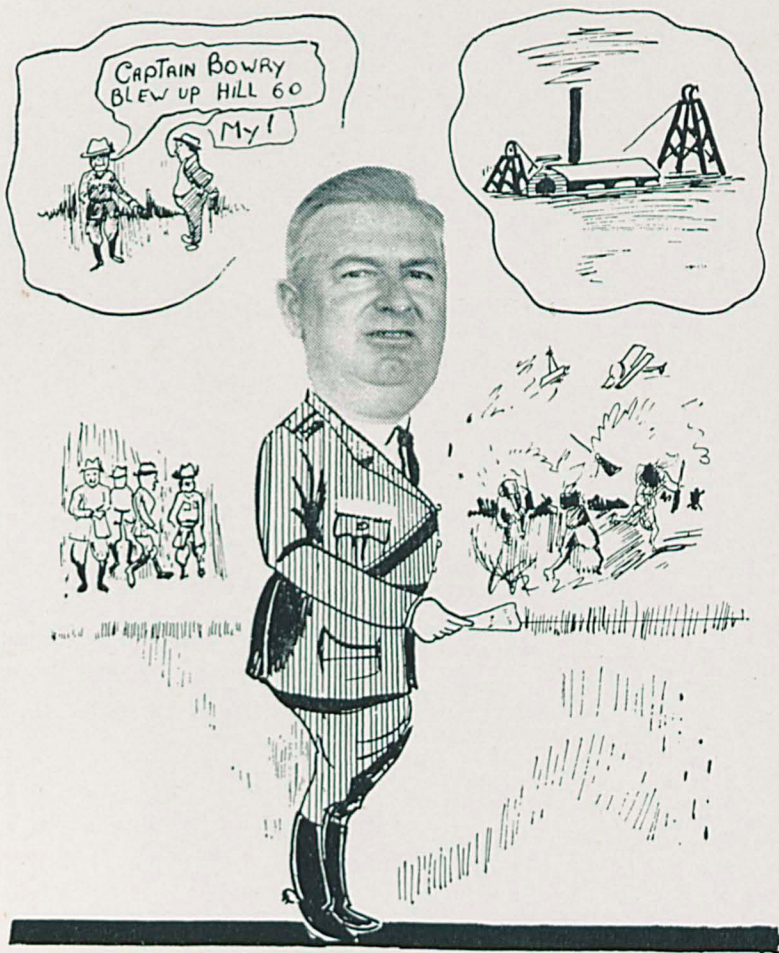
BOCK, Frederick

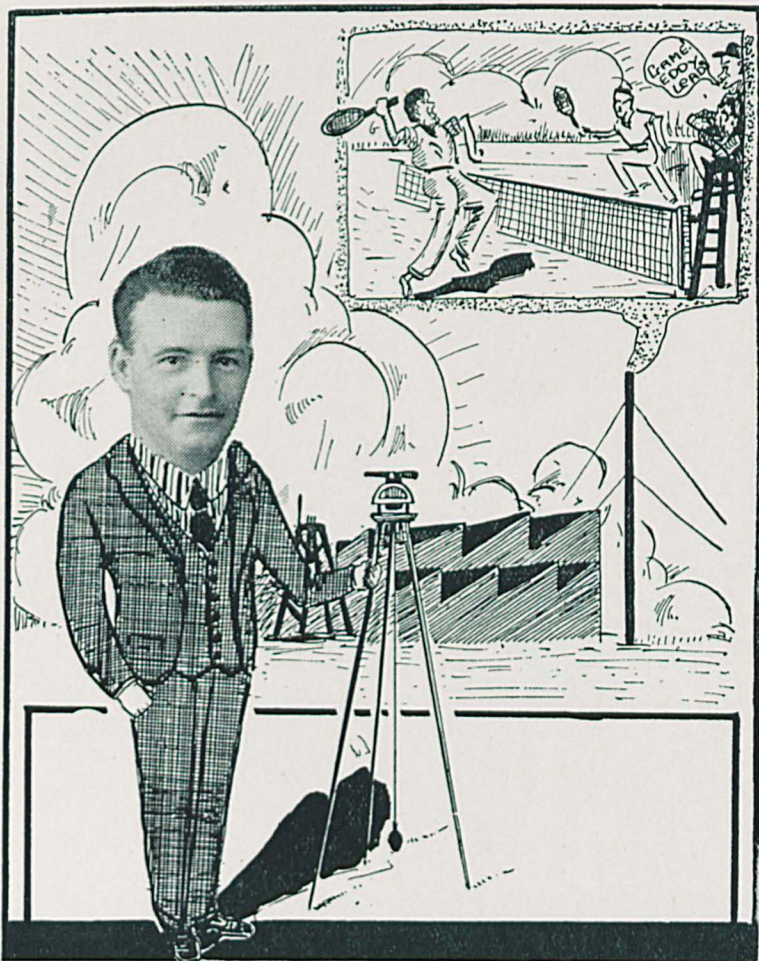


BOWRY, Captain James, A.C.T.S.M.

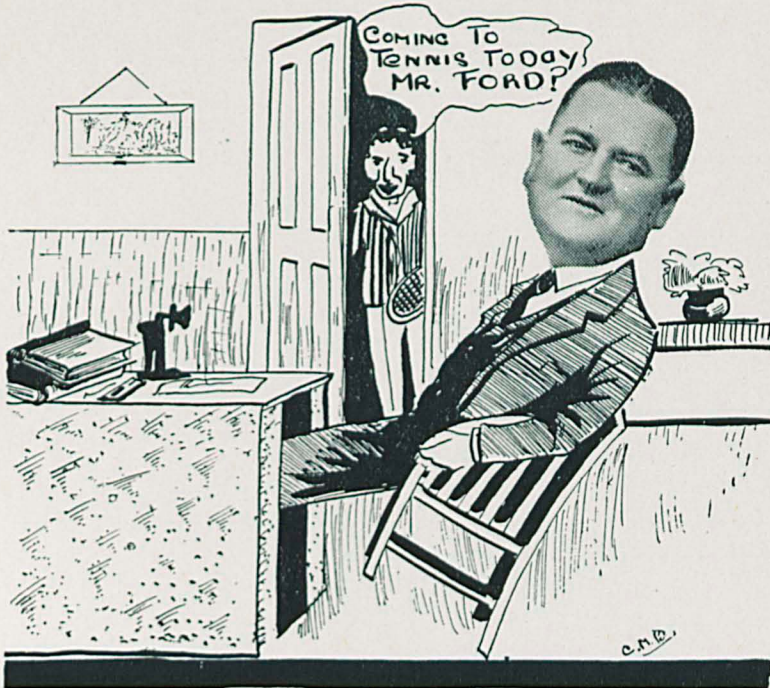
EDDY, John Trezise

1922 to 1927 Surveyor of Oroya Links Limited.



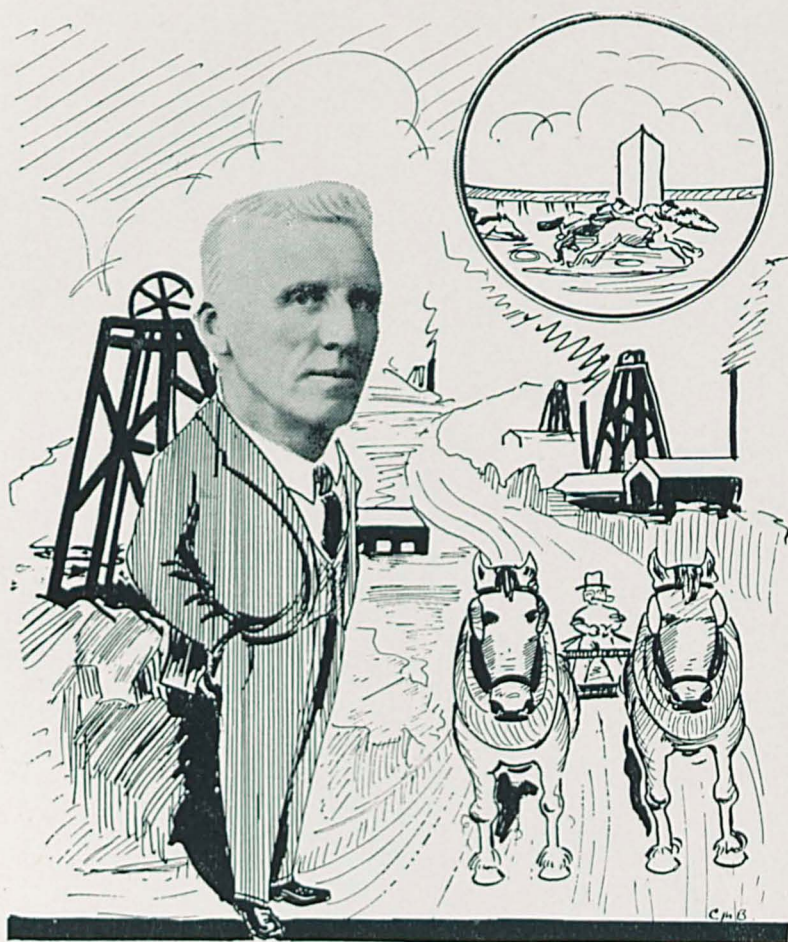
FORD, John Hubert Vincent (Bert)

For many years was cartage contractor for the principal mines at Boulder. Mr. Gaynor also had many other interests, including a cordial factory and mining activities.



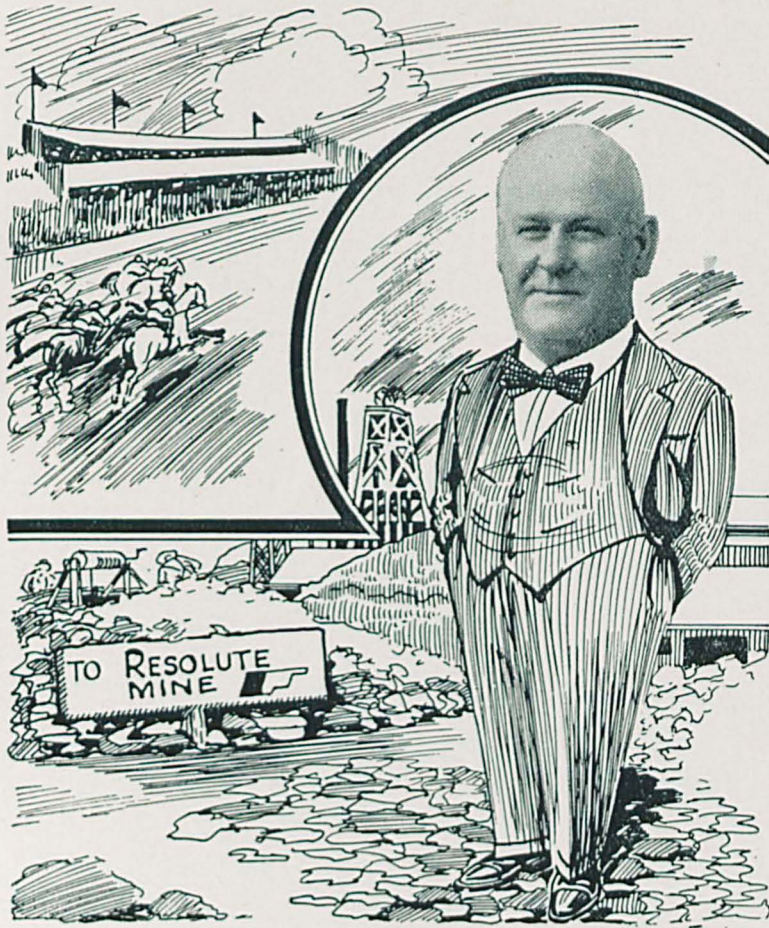
GEDDES, James Alexander

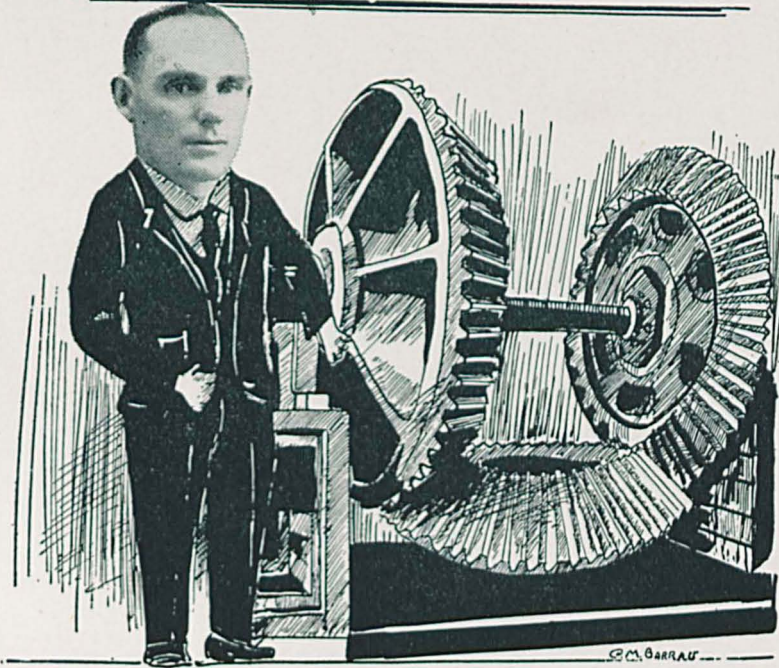
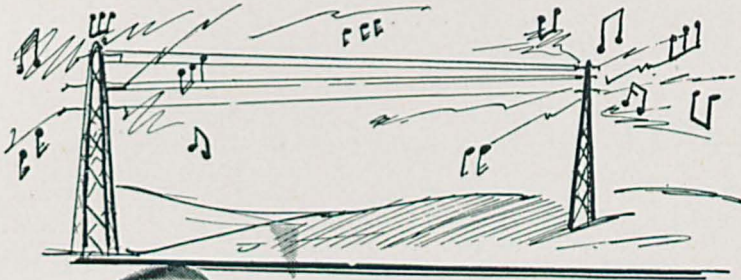
GEDDES, John, J.P.

Was prospecting in the early days of the 'fields and discovered and worked successfully The Resolute Gold Mine, 1907, and sold his interest, 1915; was also owner of the Wheel of Fortune Gold Mine and other interests. Before coming to the Goldfields was actively engaged in pastoral work in New South Wales. Councillor of Moama, N.S.W., 13 years, and held office of Mayor two terms in the same council. Was prominent as a footballer (League game), also sculling and rowing, and had the unique record of never being defeated. Champion high jumper of Victoria for many years. His interests with the turf in N.S.W. were most successful. Amongst his string of horses was Jubilee, which later won the Rajah's Cup in India.



GRANGER, Victor

Chief Engineer, Lake View and Star Group, Boulder.

Born Forrest Lodge, N.S.W., 1889.

Came to the Goldfields, 1928. Educated Paramatta South Superior Public School, N.S.W., and Melbourne Technical School, Victoria. Son of the late Hon. Lieutenant-Colonel W. Granger. Recreations: Music, wireless, and bridge.

Jointed the Company 1928 as Chief Draughtsman. Appointed present position 1929. Before joining Company was senior Draughtsman, Charles Ruwolt Proprietary Limited, Melbourne.

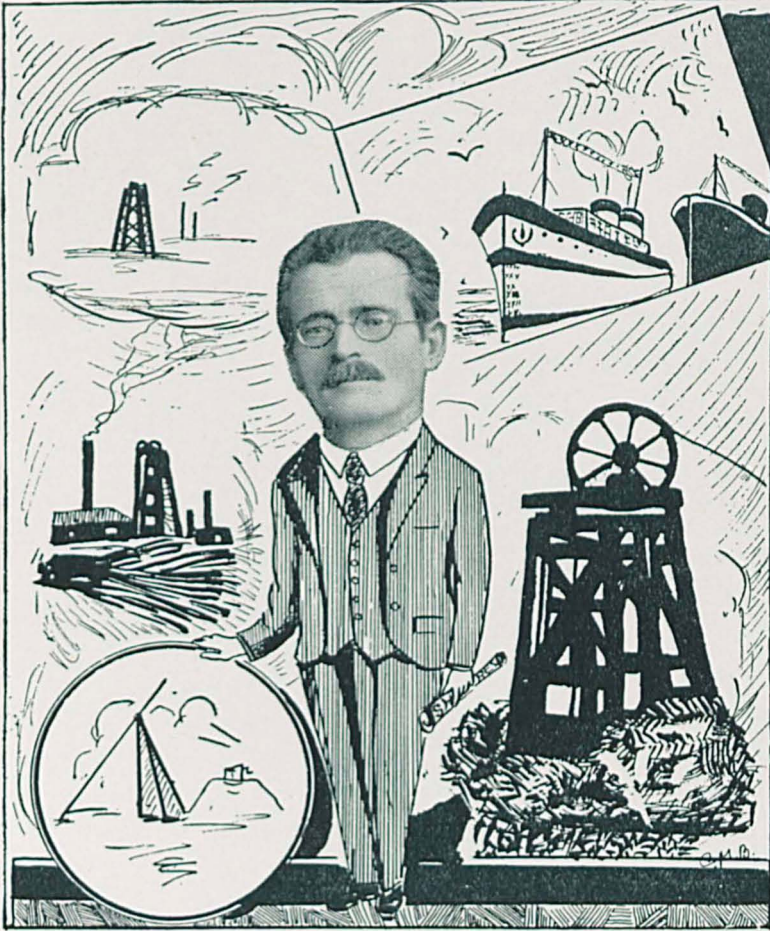


GREENHILL, Thomas William Warren

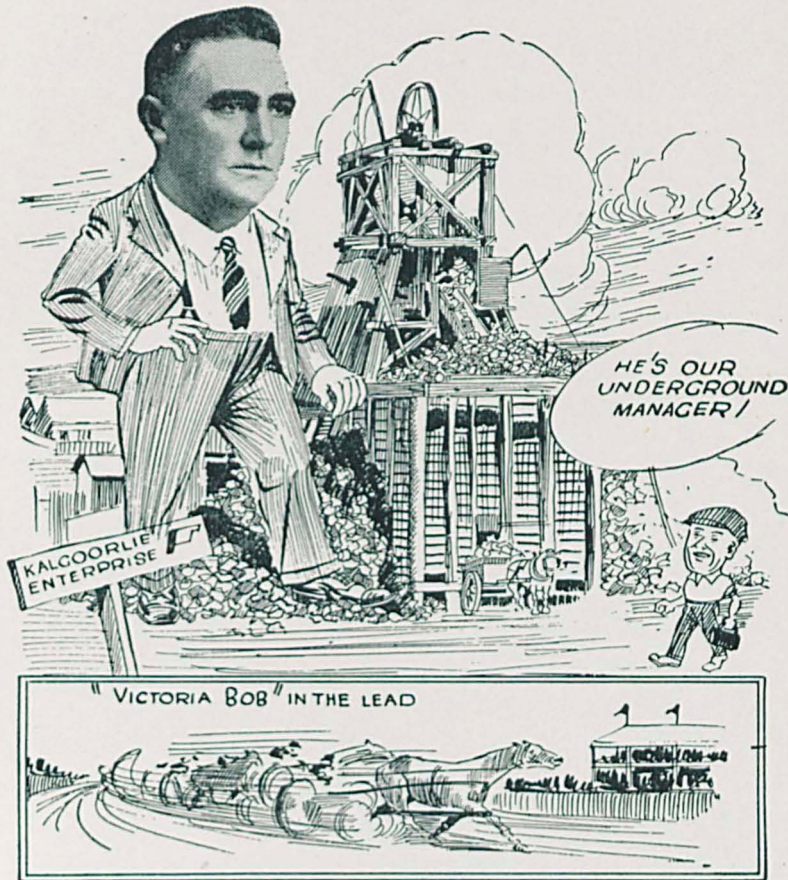
GRUNDT, William

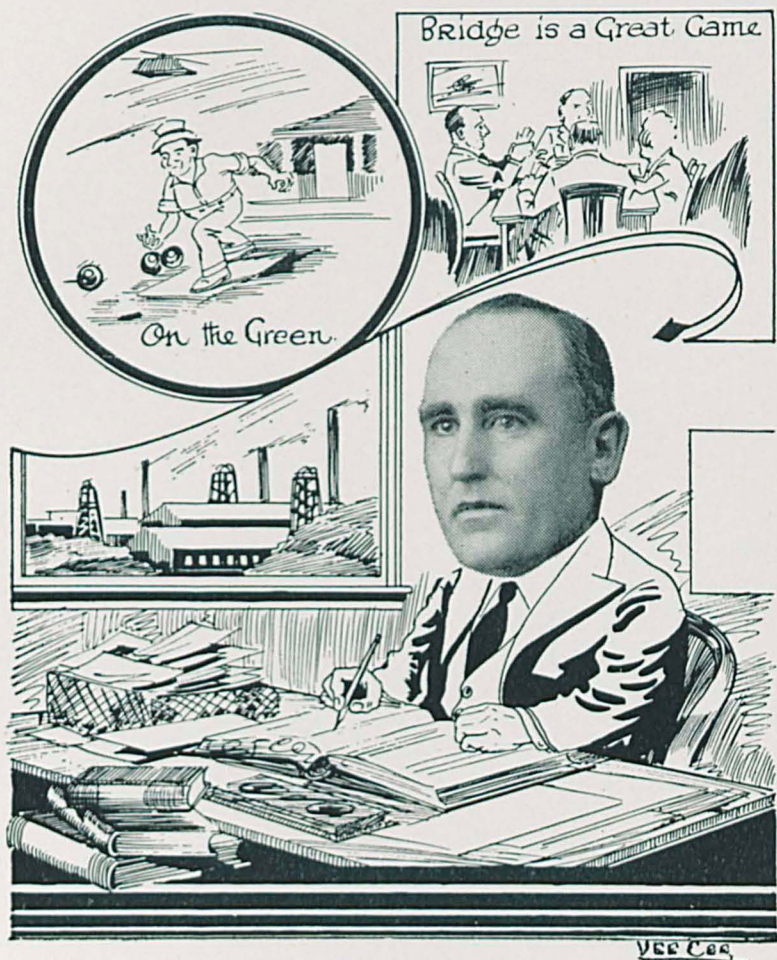
GUNN, Richard T.

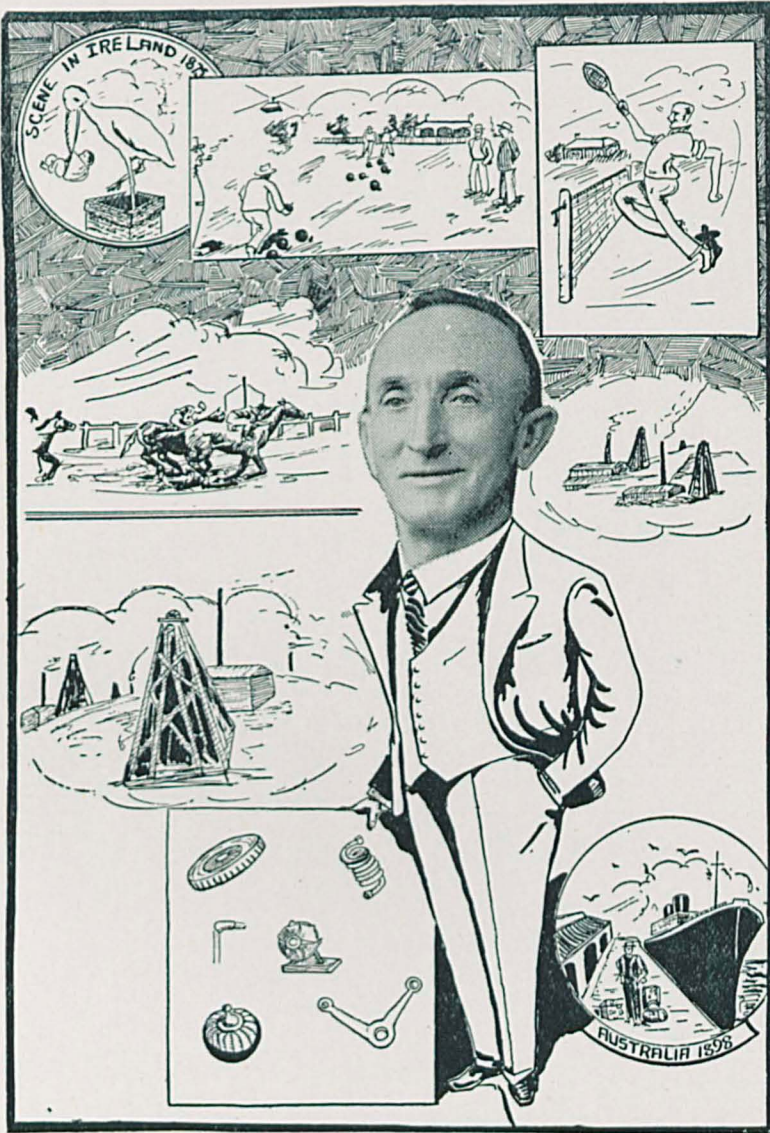
HOLLINS, Thomas
