New Orchid Species Found in Waroona



Who would have thought that in this day and age, not one but two, new and very exciting orchids have been discovered in the hills above Waroona.

Discovered by Professor Kingsley Dixon and botanists from the Royal Botanic Gardens Kew, England in October this year, these two beautiful orchids grow on high laterite plateaus off Nanga Brook Road.

Close relatives of the common yellow

cowslip orchid, the two new species are yet to get a common name so we are asking readers of this article to suggest common names. (You can email your suggestions to drakesdespatch@gmail.com and we will forward them on). Their latin names are *Caladenia lateritica* (is white and indicates the specialised habitat) and *Caladenia rosea* (because of its delightful rose pink colour).

What makes them distinct is their colour, habitat (deep laterite plateaus) but the really exciting difference with the common yellow cowslip (beside the colour) is that both species are sweetly scented. The reason for this is that the two new species use a special flower deception to copy the flowers of common plants that grow with the orchid – for the white orchid mimics the white cottontail (*Conostylis setosa*) and the pink species the Swan River Myrtle.

The orchids probably occur sporadically in the region however the two plateaus above the Murray River are home to many thousands of each species.



And why have these orchids not been found before? The region where they grow is amazingly rough terrain and requires some intrepid 4WD to get to the locations – not the faint-hearted, so they have remained hidden from view in their own piece unique bushland. Both species are so restricted and rare that they are proposed to be listed as Critically Endangered as much of the area is now subject to extensive mining of the laterite plateaus.

Heat stroke in pets

Heat stroke is a **common** and **life threatening** condition seen in our hot summers. When the temperature or humidity is high your pets may be at risk of developing heat stroke. The signs of heat stroke can include:

- Excessive panting and or salivation
- Vomiting and or diarrhoea
- Bright red or bluish gums.
- Altered behaviour or failure to respond

- Rapid heartbeat
- Seizures

Lethargy, muscular weakness, collapse and coma
Heat stroke can kill quickly. If your pet exhibits any of these signs you need to seek veterinary attention immediately. If you think your pet is suffering from the serious effects of heat stress cool your pet with tepid (never cold) water and contact your vet as soon as possible.

What to avoid, what to do:

- Avoid exercising or walking your dog in hot weather. Generally if it is too hot for you, it is too hot for your pet.

- Never leave your pet in a car. An animal left inside a closed car on a hot day can die in less than 6 minutes. Leaving the window down will not prevent the car from reaching extreme temperatures. Leave your pet at home rather than taking them in the car if you can avoid it.

- Dogs on the back of utes can get very hot and uncomfortable quickly. Dogs travelling on the back of utes must be secured and have access to shade (a canopy) and water. If parked up make sure your pet is in the shade.

- Always have water available to your pet and take it with you when you take your pet out.

- Don't forget outdoor pets - ensure outdoor pets have access to shade and water at all times. You may need to wet dogs down or provide a pool filled with water for them to lie in during the hottest parts of the day. Some breeds are more susceptible to heat stress. Any breed with a short nose (brachycephalic) is especially at risk (e.g. Boxers, Pugs, Bulldogs, Pekinese). Also take more care with

longhaired, overweight, very young or old animals or any animal with health issues (e.g. heart conditions). Any pet that really struggles with the hot weather would benefit from being kept in an air conditioned environment during the worst of the heat. Some longhaired pets may benefit from a clipped coat. This is not suitable for all breeds as for some the coat acts just like insulation – heating the dog in winter and cooling the dog in summer.

Rabbits, chickens and other small pets such as **guinea pigs** are not immune to heat stroke either. If your small pet lives in an outdoor hutch or coop ensure it is out of direct sunlight and water is always available. Large blocks of ice can help keep your pets cool on hot days. Freeze water in plastic bottles and place them inside the hutches or coops. They will act like a mini evaporative air conditioner and can be changed as needed. If your small pet has an indoor cage consider bringing them inside to escape the worst of the heat.

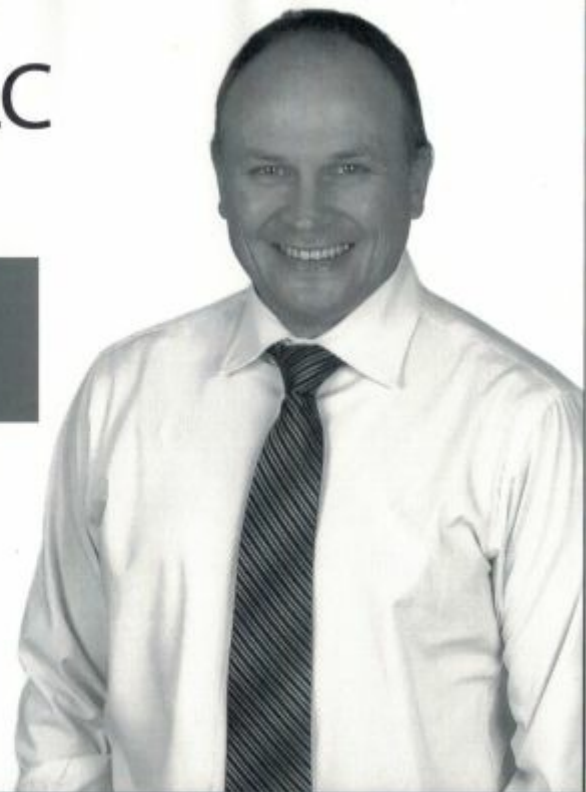

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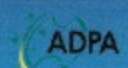

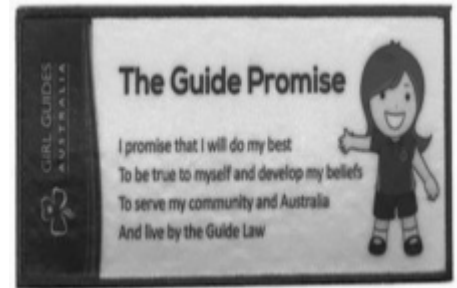

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To Cruise or Not to Cruise, That is the Question.

In 1973 Pam, myself and out 18 month old daughter, Rachael boarded the RHMS Ellinis in Southampton bound for Sydney Australia. Pam was



pregnant at the time, so was unable to have all the required injections to enter Australia. This meant we had to travel by sea instead of the preferred option to fly. Many people on board the ship were on a world cruise. Others like us were 30 pound POMS, as over the years the Ellinis had been used to transport migrants. For 30 pound we didn't expect much, but the claustrophobic cabin appeared much smaller with a cot squeezed in there as well.

Pam started vomiting in Southampton harbour before we sailed. (She was pregnant after all) The Suez Canal was closed so we had to go around the Cape of Good Hope. We stopped at the Canary Isles and then Cape Town, where we were met by friends of my sister. Unfortunately Rachael was teething at the time which took away somewhat the pleasure of meeting my sister's friends.

Each time we boarded the ship Pam's sickness came back.

On Leaving Cape Town we were told there weren't and stabilizers on the ship. An ominous sign that we were in for rough weather was the closing of the swimming pool and the brown paper bags slotted along the passage ways of the ship.

For some reason children were not allowed in the dining room when the adults ate dinner at 8 pm. This wasn't a problem before Cape Town, as we were able to get Rachael to sleep before we ate. However, there is an eight hour time difference between Cape Town and Sydney, so clocks were altered every couple of days. Adults can adjust to that, but 18 month old children cannot. Rachael was not ready to sleep when it was our dinner time, so even though she felt queasy, I sent Pam to the dining room to eat something. Unfortunately several minutes later someone at our

cabin door informed me that Pam had fainted outside the dining room. Leaving Rachael alone in the cabin, presumably just for a few minutes I went to assist Pam. On returning, we could hear Rachael screaming down the corridor. On reaching the cabin we found the door open and Rachael in the arms of an ancient Greek Witch purporting to be a stewardess, grinning at Rachael, exposing her gold fillings and pinching her rosy cheeks, as if she was about to eat her. (She did not speak English) Before we reached Fremantle our next delight was the blocking of the toilets just around the corner from our cabin. The overflow in the toilets was bad enough, but when it started swishing down the corridors each time the ship lurched it was just too much.

We did arrive in Sydney in one piece, but both vowed to never go on a ship again. Move on 45 years and everybody we know is cruising, so we decided to try a very short 5 day cruise as a tester. We were booked on the MV Astor,



cruise around to Esperance and Albany in January on such a ship would be a delight. The day we left, Perth experienced 94 mm of rain. This continued through the night and the next day, preventing us from going out on the deck. Fortunately the accommodation, the food, the crew and the entertainment were top class. The skies cleared in Esperance, and we were transported by a small tender to board a coach for a 7 hour tour of the area. We visited a fish tanning factory, which sold beautiful, but expensive fish leather products. We travelled past the Esperance copy of Stonehenge, Frenchman's Peak and visited several beautiful beaches, having lunch at Lucky Beach.

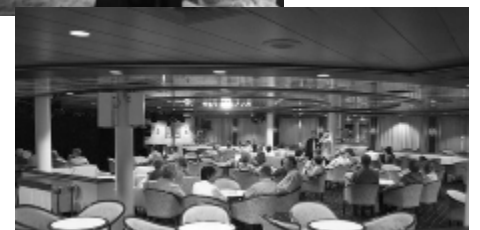
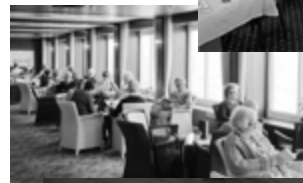
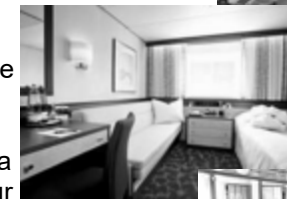


The next morning we were piped into Albany by a lone Scotsman. Here we went on

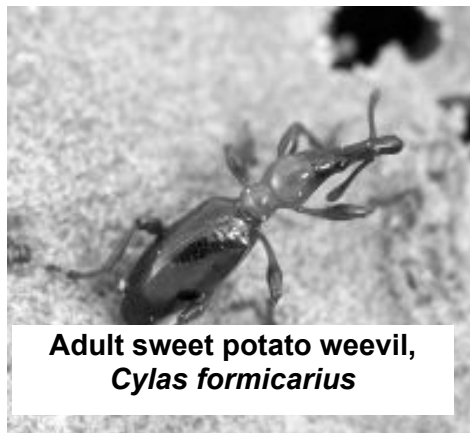
Your monthly guide to animal and plant pests, diseases and weeds

The sweet potato weevil, *Cylas formicarius*, is a devastating pest of sweet potatoes. It causes damage to the tuber whilst in the ground and after harvest whilst in storage. This insect is of quarantine concern and is a Declared pest in Western Australia.

While sweet potato weevil is found widely around the world in tropical regions, in Australia it is found only in Queensland where it is widespread. Most of WA's sweet potatoes are imported from Queensland. Whether your sweet potatoes are purchased or home grown, keep an eye out for signs of this pest, and if you suspect anything, report it quickly. Crop losses can range from 5-95% where this pest has established

What to look for

- Damaged tubers
- Live weevils

Not so sweet potato

Adult weevils are less than 1cm and have a black head and snout (rostrum). The antennae, thorax and legs are orange to reddish brown; the abdomen and elytra are a dark brown. Adults are often hidden from view as they feed on the under surface of the leaves. Females lay eggs into a small

cavity chewed into the sweet potato tuber or stem. When the egg hatches the larvae bores into the tuber and creates winding tunnels packed with faecal matter while it feeds and grows.

How to help

Inspect both home grown and store-bought produce for signs of live insects or damage similar to that in the photos. If you find something suspicious, place the sample in a plastic bag or container, place in the freezer and then report! You will be asked for photos to assist with identification, and to provide details about the location of purchase. If found in the home garden, please inspect the plants further, take samples and report. We'll provide additional advice and guidance from there.

...An exciting partnership project between the Peel-Harvey Catchment Council (PHCC), Department of Biodiversity Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) and Project Numbat is providing support to landholders near the Dryandra Woodland to control feral animals on their properties to protect threatened native animals. Dryandra Woodland is a National Park and is located in the upper reaches of the Peel-Harvey catchment, straddling the Shires of Narrogin, Cuballing, Williams and Wandering. The woodland is one of WA's most valuable nature conservation reserves as it is home to unique native flora and fauna species, including the threatened woylie (*Bettongia penicillata*) and Western Australia's state mammal emblem, the numbat (*Myrmecobius fasciatus*). Dryandra is the largest remnant of original vegetation in the western wheatbelt and the only area left in WA where Numbats live where they have not been re-introduced. The former Threatened Species Commissioner had a particular affinity with our Numbats and, in putting their vulnerability into context, used to quote that Numbats are rarer than Black



Rhino's. Numbats are one of the 20 mammals identified in the Commonwealth Government's Threatened Species Strategy. The Strategy acknowledges the role farmers and private landholders play in the conservation of our native animals and it has an ambitious target of culling 2 million feral cats across Australia by 2020. Monitoring at Dryandra shows that feral cats and foxes are coming into the woodland through adjacent bushland and farmland areas, and woylie and numbat populations were continuing to decline. In response the DBCA introduced the Dryandra Numbat Woylie (Predator Control) project in 2015 and began working with the community, and collaborating with neighbouring landowners to assist to protect these iconic mammals. The Predator Control project enabled some complementary feral predator control initiatives to be introduced in addition to the ongoing baiting to control foxes. The Farmers 4 Fauna is enabling greater support for Farmers to be involved, with over 70 Farmers attending the launch of the project. The PHCC and Project Numbat are now engaging with surrounding landholders who are enthusiastic about playing a significant role in the protection of our native animals through the Farmers 4 Fauna project. By applying this coordinated approach across public and private land, PHCC, DBCA, Project Numbat and the

Farming community aim to increase the number of native animals in, and around the Park and minimise risks to agriculture from disease and predation by foxes and feral cats. The Farmers 4 Fauna project is already seeing the Farming community band together towards this common goal. Farmers around Dryandra now have access to free cat traps and 1080 baits which have been provided to the Shires of Cuballing, Narrogin, Wandering and Williams. Training and licensing support is also being provided, as well as events and field days which will continue to bring the Farming community together to share information and success stories. Monitoring will continue to assess the impact of the actions and focus efforts to areas of most need. PHCC Chairman Andy Gulliver said – "The Farmers 4 Fauna project is a great example of how successful partnerships can achieve fantastic things for our community and our environment. This project will result in meaningful support for some of our most treasured native species, in one of the most significant bushland remnants remaining across the West Australian Wheatbelt. We thank both the DBCA and Project Numbat for all their hard work in the development and initiation of this great project, and our Farming community for their enthusiasm in playing a key role in protecting our native animals". This project is supported by the Peel-Harvey Catchment Council through funding from the Australian Gov. National Landcare Program.

Land Care Loop

Fire-recovery grants 2018 – Do you have a property still recovering from the Waroona-Yarloop 2016 fire? Due to the success of the first round grants in 2017 and our ongoing commitment to assist the rural community, the Shire of Waroona in partnership with the Peel-Harvey Catchment Council have grants up to \$10,000 available to help you undertake land care projects in the Waroona-Yarloop 2016 fire zone. The grants are supported by funding from the Western Australian Government's State NRM Program, supported by Royalties for Regions. Projects include those that protect waterways, restore habitat, control pests and weeds, and improve soil health. Last year's grants resulted in 14 properties (576ha) in the Waroona and Harvey shires undertake recovery projects such as cotton bush and rabbit control, fencing creeks and

bush areas, and re-planting vegetation. Applicants that missed out on funding last year are also encouraged to re-apply. For an application kit contact Megan LeRoy at the Waroona Landcare Centre on 9733 2628 or email megan.leroy@peel-harvey.org.au or drop in at 93 South Western Hwy, Waroona (Mon/Tue/Thursday). **Plastic bag ban** – From July 1st 2018, lightweight single-use plastic bags will be banned statewide in Western Australia, due to the negative environmental impacts that plastics have on our soils, waterways, marine environments and fauna. 360 million plastic shopping bags are used in Western Australia annually, most end up in landfill, but about 5 million are littered. These impact wildlife and easily blow into waterways and the ocean. Plastics don't biodegrade but

break up into microplastics, which are ingested by lower order marine animals and enter the human food chain. As a customer, from July 1st, you will need to use alternatives to carry your shopping such as reusable green bags, hessian bags or cooler bags.

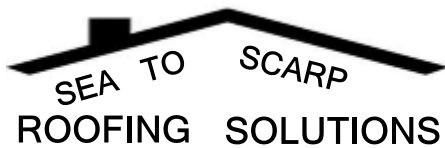
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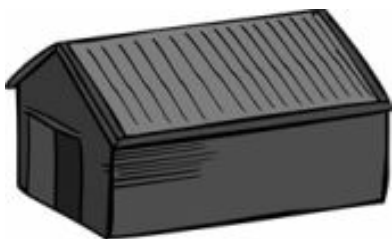

Despite the lack of extreme hot weather for summer so far the humidity factor has taken its toll with the loss of 3 hens joining Rainbow Heaven in the past four days. They included "Wild Thing" a New Hampshire dropped off 3 years ago during a football final by our Chief Steward John Kennington from Stakehill, Ace a silver lace Wyandotte raised from a chick and another Amigo a black Australorp. The former two won prizes at both Brunswick and Waroona Shows. Always sad to lose a family pet but poultry generally only have a short life span. Good news is that 2 weeks ago took Clare a Black Mottled Duccle young hen to Waroona Vet Services suffering from heat stress and dehydration and Dr Jessica Associate Vet confirmed the diagnosis of heat stress and dehydration. She survived the first 12 hours on Anitone and then was spoilt for 3 nights living in the family room watching the Big Bash Cricket with the Air Conditioning working overtime. Bought a small bottle of Anitone for Ahmed your local friendly chemist who had also lost one of four chooks received as a Christmas present and hopefully it assists the recuperation process for the remaining three. It continues to surprise me with the number of rural families having a few chooks to supply fresh eggs and a good healthy source of protein. Sent 3 cockerels and six spatcocks to my good friend "Peters Processing" plant which further reduces numbers in Chookyard Hotel. Will be selling surplus young ones at the local

auction in March and this includes Bantam Belgium Duccles and Gold Lace Wyandottes and together with Gold Lace standard Wyandottes and Araucanas and Brown Leghorns. Some silver laced Wyandotte chicks and Rhode Island Reds from two batches of 13 chicks from Mundijong Markets are also showing promise. Sold 4 small chicks to keep orphan chicks to a poultry club member and a friend from North Dandalup and they have reported acceptance and settled into their new home. The nightly transfer of 9 chicks to Priscilla a "Faverolle" and Truffle a Plymouth Rock and her five chicks is a testing time to return to their brooder cages to ensure their safety especially from "Mr Fox" and birds of prey. End up sweating profusely just like the boys engaged in pre-season training under League Coach Dean Taylor. Gretel a Bantam is well trained and takes her remaining five chicks to bed and same with "One Amigo and her 3 remaining chicks. Comes with the maturity of chicks having a sense of where the night secure best/home is based. The unusual heavy summer rain, followed by a humid spell has ensured the lawnmowers are working overtime and both residents of Chookyard Hotel and Wallys Orchard have enjoyed the green grass clippings to benefit both poultry and fruit trees. Also pleased to report have picked my first home grown lime and they certainly finish off a "Cold Corona" to enjoy during the summer months and beyond. My friend Peter with myself as TA have installed a Back Gate to allow the Gold Lace Bantams and some young ones a chance to free range late in the day or early morning in just 2.5 hours. 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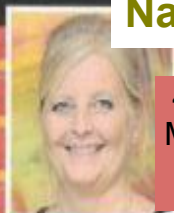
