Western Australia Day

On June 1, 1829, Western Australia's coast was first sighted from the merchant ship *Barque Parmelia*. This led to the establishment of the Swan River Colony, the first permanent British colony in Western Australia. Western Australia Day (formerly Foundation Day) is officially celebrated on June 1, but the public holiday is observed on the first Monday in June.

The first Europeans to visit the Western coast of Australia were Dutch explorers in the 1600s. Later a French party also visited the area. However, many early visitors were not positive about the land's potential so they travelled further.

In 1826, the first British settlement, an outpost of the army, was established in Western Australia. During 1827, Admiral Sir James Stirling led a number of explorations along Australia's west coast and recommended that a permanent settlement should be established in the Swan River area. In 1829, he returned to the area with a navy vessel, *HMS Challenger*, and the merchant ship *Barque Parmelia*.

On June 1, 1829, Australia's west coast was sighted from the *Parmelia*, although the ship did not reach anchor until the following day. Later that year, more ships arrived in the area and Perth was officially founded. The area was known as the Swan River Colony until 1832, when it became known as Western Australia. In 1834, Stirling, who was now administrator of Western Australia, decided to hold an annual celebration to unite the settlers, masters, servants and Indigenous Australians within and around the colony. June 1 was the chosen date because it was the anniversary of the first sighting of Western Australia from the *Parmelia*.

Foundation Day was renamed Western Australia Day in 2011 under new laws which recognise Aboriginal people as the original inhabitants of the land.

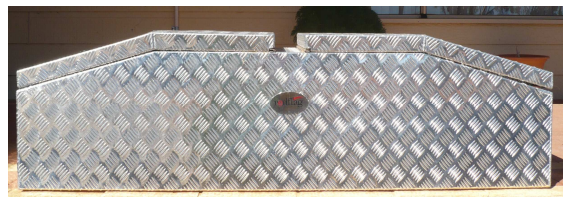

Both teams fronted up with only 16 players on the field in a CWFL trial to overcome a general shortage of players. This modified form of the game allows each side 6 additional players on the interchange. The Bombers adjusted well to the new format, but holes in the normal field placings created a little uncertainty for inexperienced players who had difficulty picking up their man coming off the interchange. Murray Junk did a great job deputizing for Coach Ty Kirby who was busy seeding in the Deep South.

Docker started in the ruck where he knocked the ball down to Munnsy (Daniel) but it came unstuck and despite Gardy's hard work at centre half back, Bencubbin were first to score with a behind. The Bombers inexperience saw them turn the ball over by bringing it across the field too soon after the kick-in and the Demons snaffled the first goal for the day. Ryan Miguel's (Oigs') welcome return from long term injury was soon rewarded with a goal after marking a well-timed pass from Josh Munns who kicked to Oigs' advantage at full forward. Gardy made some good saves before Benny goaled again, then Trizzo opened his own account before passing to Oigs who brought up our third major. Trapper rucked to Hendo who cleared the ball out of the centre while Richie, Oigs, Keegan and Josh were amongst many players who worked hard for the Bombers.

Score at Quarter Time: Bencubbin 5 – 2 (32) vs Beacon 3 – 2 (20)

Docker won the first ruck knock but the Bombers seemed to have run out of steam. In the first quarter the game had been played in bright sunshine and we'd had our share of the play without scoring much and seemed to have run out of legs. Josh continued to dive in everywhere and Tyson showed "flashes" (get it?) of brilliance. Trizzo, Richie and Munnsy worked hard while Denim and Gardy snuck in a couple of goals. Meanwhile the Demons struck their colours in an impressive display, gaining the upper hand around centre clearances and piled on 8 goals.

Docker and Trapper continued to ruck well and the Bombers' ball-carriers continues to make an impression on Benny's mid-field. Keegan and Wanna were outstanding, each kicking another goal. Trizzo took an impressive contested mark at centre half forward but was unable to convert. Josh kicked to Wanna who passed to Denim who kicked his second for the day. Josh combined with Wanna, and Trizzo soon had another goal. We almost kept pace with Benny most of the day, but the second quarter lapse cost us dearly.

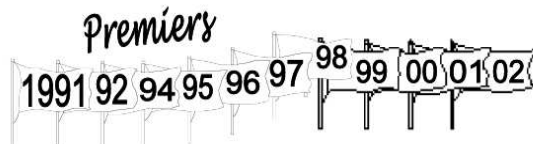

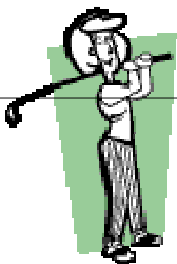


The Mini-Miracles had a fun game against Bencubbin on our home court. Abby made strong leads on the centre pass and backline throw-

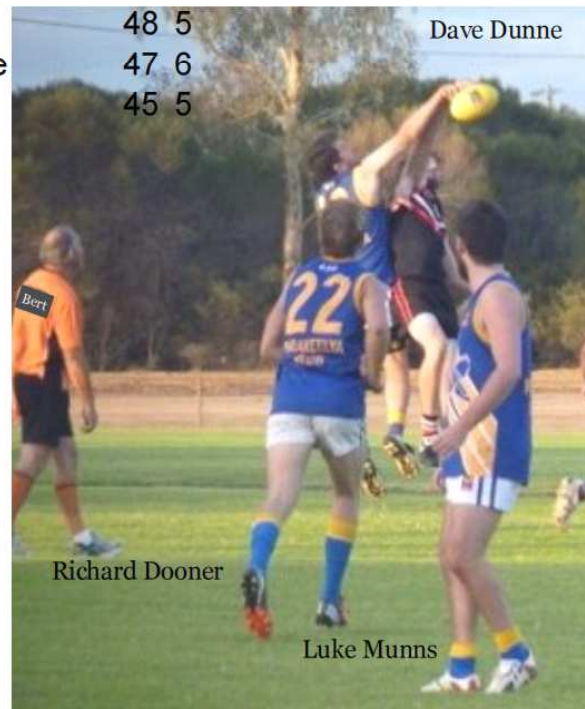

Lucky school boosts kids in Wheatbelt

When Churchlands Primary School found out that last year a tiny Wheatbelt school had collected only enough supermarket education vouchers for a maths concept rug, they decided to help.

Their own P&C's fundraising brings in \$50,000 a year to buy extra equipment and supplement student learning programs.

So this year, Churchlands families will be collecting Woolworths Earn and Learn docket for the 35-student school at Beacon, 290km north-east of Churchlands. Shoppers get one sticker for every \$10 they spend, and the program is heavily promoted by schools.

Last year, at principal Donna Snow's last school, Dalkeith Primary, families of the Year 3s alone racked up \$398,000 at the supermarket.

Churchlands P&C head Lucette Quinlan invited shoppers who were not connected to the school to help it help Beacon.

"It's about helping a school doing it tough in an area doing it tough," she said.

Last term, Churchlands was involved in Governor Malcolm McCusker's Kids Who Give WA program, and teachers wanted to extend the giving.

"Recent press surrounding the plight of WA wheat farmers and the impact on rural communities prompted us to investigate a partnership with a rural school where our giving may ease the burden in some small way," Donna said.

Beacon principal Brooke Chitty said she had been very excited to get the call from Churchlands.

"Our P&C is very proactive and our small community is very supportive of our school," Brooke said. "But we really appreciate the generosity."

Brooke said the vouchers would probably go to resources for literacy, numeracy, science, and history teaching.

THE NETWORK IN ACTION—HISTORY PROJECT

Thanks to the Inland Lighthouse Network (ILN), fifty Year 7 students from eleven primary schools in the Central Wheatbelt are using online resources to complete the History curriculum and develop their technological skills.

Wongan Hills District High School Principal Ilona Jachmann said the History program, which began earlier this year, was fundamental to the successful transition of the students into secondary school.

"The expectation for all students is to have in-depth knowledge of the History curriculum, especially Year 7 students," Mrs Jachmann said.

"The course has the added advantage of providing social contact for these students, including some who are the only Year 7 students in their school, and fosters existing peer relationships."

From 2015, Year 7 students will be taught under the new Australian Curriculum in secondary settings, giving them access to specialist subject teaching and facilities.

The weekly program is run by Wongan Hills District High School history coordinator Susan Maguire with the help of staff at each school site and takes place through Centra web conferencing, and bi-annual face-to-face lessons.

Webcams are set up to allow interaction between Mrs Maguire and the students, who then use their workbooks and online resources to complete their lessons.

"The children can see my face on their computer screen, and when their webcams are on you can see what they are doing and therefore gauge the level of their involvement," Mrs Maguire said.



"Centra creates a virtual classroom, so that all participants can see who is attending and who has their hand up. Also, the audio is heard by all, so when one student answers a question, all students hear the answer."

Activities range from interactive maps that show the migration of man from Africa, carbon dating and virtual 3D tours of the Lascaux caves.

Students will also participate in a mini archaeological dig in Term 3 to compliment their studies into Scotland's Neolithic Skara Brae settlement.

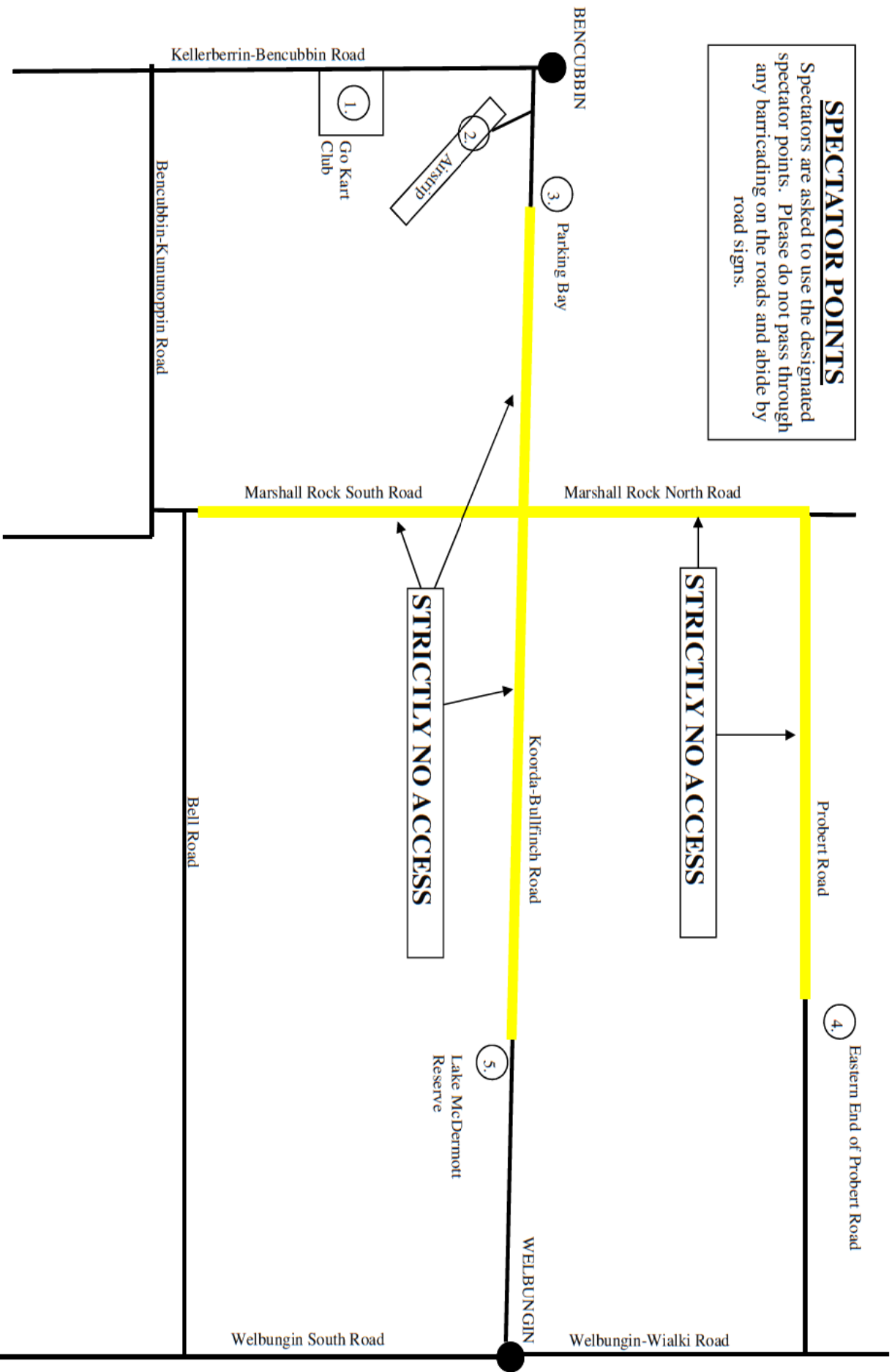

Satellite Subsidy Scheme

Australia is well on the way to switching to digital-only TV. By the end of 2013 analog free-to-air TV signals will be switched off and replaced with digital-only signals.

Households in some towns across regional and remote Australia will need to move across to the Viewer Access Satellite Television (VAST) service to continue watching free-to-air TV. VAST is a direct-to-home digital TV satellite service that offers the same number of digital channels received in metropolitan areas.

The Australian Government is providing practical and financial assistance to help eligible households switch to digital TV through the Satellite Subsidy Scheme and the Household Assistance Scheme.

Which channels will be on the new VAST service?

The VAST service will show the following 17 digital channels:

The VAST service also includes dedicated local news channels.

What is the Satellite Subsidy Scheme?

The Satellite Subsidy Scheme offers a subsidised installation of satellite TV equipment (a satellite dish, VAST set-top box and associated cabling) for eligible households.

The scheme will be rolled out progressively across Australia. Eligible households may receive a letter inviting them to apply for the subsidy when it opens in their area.

A list of eligible towns is on the Digital Ready website at www.digitalready.gov.au.

Am I eligible for the subsidy?

To be eligible for the subsidy:

- households must rely on TV reception from an analog self-help TV tower not being converted to digital
- the applicant must be the owner, landlord or tenant of the dwelling where the equipment is to be installed and be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia aged 18 years or over, and
- the dwelling where the equipment is to be installed must be a self-contained residential dwelling, at a distinct address. Commercial dwellings are not eligible for the subsidy.

Will I have to pay anything?

Yes, you will incur some cost to convert to digital TV. Eligible households that receive the VAST installation package will have to contribute to the cost of installation, payable directly to the contractor on the day of installation. This is a one-off cost and there are no ongoing fees to receive the VAST service.

How do I apply for the subsidy?

Step 1: Check your eligibility and apply online by visiting the Digital Ready website at www.digitalready.gov.au/subsidy or calling the Digital Ready Information Line on **1800 20 10 13** between 8am and 10pm (AEST), 7 days.

Step 2: If you have applied and are eligible, you will be sent a letter from the service contractor with details about how your installation will be arranged.

Step 3: A government-engaged service contractor will contact you by phone or letter to arrange an installation time.

Step 4: The VAST equipment will be installed. On the day of installation, you pay the government-engaged service contractor the household contribution amount.

What is the Household Assistance Scheme?

The Household Assistance Scheme offers easy to use digital TV equipment (including VAST equipment), in-home installation and demonstration, and 12 months after-care support and equipment warranty at no cost to eligible people.

To be eligible for the Household Assistance Scheme you need to own a TV, have not converted to digital and receive the full rate of one of the following pensions:

- Age Pension
- Disability Support Pension
- Carer Payment
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Service Pension, or
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Income Support Supplement.

People eligible for the Household Assistance Scheme will be sent a letter from the Department of Human Services inviting them to check their eligibility for assistance. If you think you are eligible for the Household Assistance Scheme call the Department of Human Services on 1800 55 64 43.

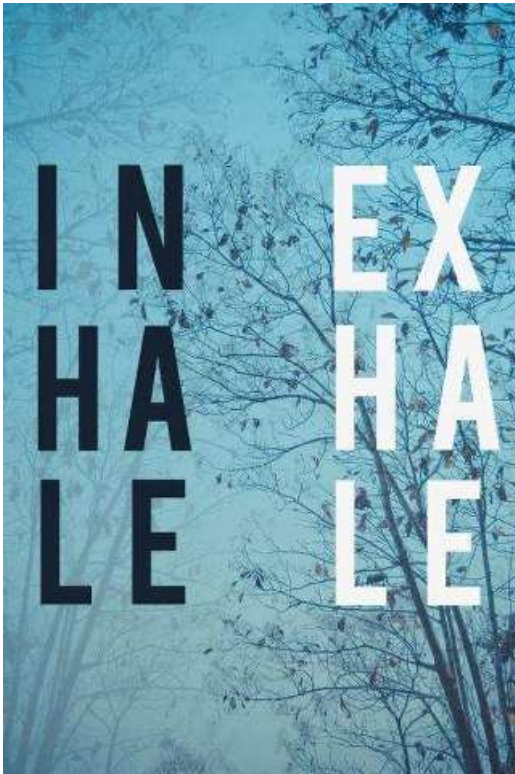

Balsamic Braised Beef

Cook: 4-6 hours **Serves:** 6-8

Sourced from: Practical Paleo, Diane Sanfilippo

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tsp rosemary
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 1 tsp onion powder
- ½ tsp paprika
- ¼ tsp black pepper
- 1-1½ kg bone in beef ribs or other beef cut
- 1 tbsp oil (I use coconut oil)
- 420g diced or pureed tomatoes
- ½ cup balsamic vinegar
- 4 whole dried dates
- 6 cloves garlic, smashed



DIRECTIONS

1. Blend the spices and rub into the short ribs.
2. Heat the oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat and sear the short ribs 1-2 minutes per side or until they are slightly browned.
3. Place the short ribs, tomatoes, balsamic vinegar, dates and garlic in a slow cooker. Cover and cook on low for 4-6 hours or until the meat is tender enough to fall apart with a fork.
4. Shred the meat off the bones and serve.

KIDS CORNER

WA Day (Foundation Day)

The first Europeans to visit the Western coast of Australia were Dutch explorers in the 1600s. Later a French party also visited the area. However, many early visitors were not positive about the land's potential so travelled further.

In 1826, the first British settlement, an outpost of the army, was established in Western Australia. During 1827, Admiral Sir James Stirling led a number of explorations along Australia's west coast and recommended that a permanent settlement should be established in the Swan River area. In 1829, he returned to the area with a navy vessel, *HMS Challenger*, and the merchant ship *Barque Parmelia*.

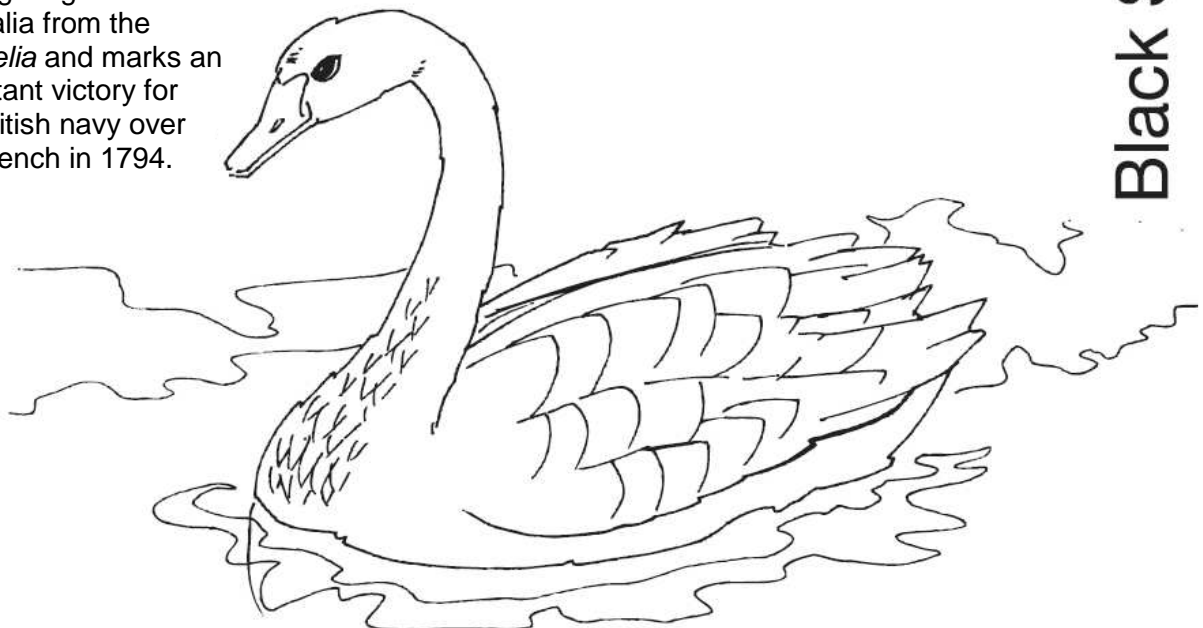
On June 1, 1829, Australia's west coast was sighted from the *Parmelia*, although the ship did not reach anchor until the following day. Later that year, more ships arrived in the area and Perth was officially founded. The area was known as the Swan River Colony until 1832, when it became known as Western Australia. In 1834, Stirling, who was now administrator of Western Australia, decided to hold an annual celebration to unite the settlers, masters, servants and Indigenous Australians within and around the colony. June 1 was the chosen date because it was the anniversary of the first sighting of Western Australia from the *Parmelia* and marks an important victory for the British navy over the French in 1794.

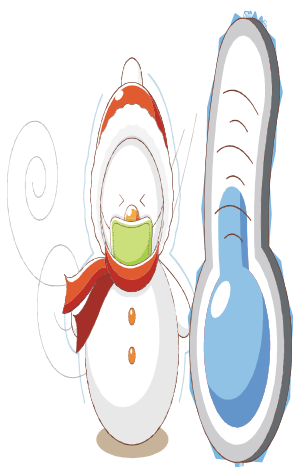

From the 10th June 2013 Bencubbin will have a second officer for a month. To date no one has applied to come to Bencubbin permanently so having a second officer only for a short time will assist me greatly providing a police presence in the area.



On Wednesday 15/5/2013 at about 1630 hours an old bluish square shaped 4wd with 4 dark skinned males on board attended a farming residence in South Yelbeni. The men requested permission to shoot on the property. One of the males has gone into the shed and attempted to steal a chain saw. Police believe the following people maybe able to assist police with their inquiries. Please see below descriptions. If you know these people of have seen the vehicle please report it to Police. It needs to be stated that only one person has attempted to steal property and the other three may not be involved.

POI 1 – Dark skinned male unsure of age, black shirt and pants, thick black hair, may have carried chain saw in his right hand and may have been wearing thongs.

POI 2 Dark skinned male 45 to 60 years old, Black greyish hair to his ears, black track pants, may have been wearing things but not sure.

POI 3 Dark skinned male 45-60 years old, Appeared the oldest one, grey hair but bald at the front, glasses that had thin grey sides, black track pants, had a shirt on with a dark and light coloured flannelette shirt over the top, had a big stomach.

POI 4 - Dark skinned male 30ish, some facial hair and had on a light coloured shirt of some description.

At 2200 hours on Saturday 18/5/2013 a vehicle was heard and seen doing burn outs in and around the townsite of Bencubbin. Areas around the seed cleaners and the CBH bins were targeted. Police attended on the night and several members of the public either attended my residence or spoke to me at the Recreation Ground. If you did see or hear something please contact me at the station and give a statement. To those people who have already spoken to me that have not given a statement please do so.

On Monday 20/05/2013 2 children were reported missing. Officers from Bencubbin, Kellerberrin, Merredin and Cunderdin responded and as a result of information from the public the boys were captured at 1500 hours. During the search members of the community from Bencubbin, Nungarin, Kununoppin and Trayning contacted Police with information which eventually assisted us in finding the boys. The boys were located safe and well.

The reality in today's world is that you can be a victim of crime, no matter where you live. The days of small country towns being a safe haven are simply gone. There are things you can do to protect your property and your family. Securing your home is an easy way to reduce the likely hood of an offence occurring in your home. Regardless of where you live, you should be able to secure your home. Doors should lock, windows should close and be able to be locked and you should have an alarm.

Alarms are not expensive and are a deterrent. Big business and people with lots of money fall into the trap of buying expensive alarm systems that run off mains power. Yes they are great but if the power is disconnected they are useless. A couple of cheap twenty to thirty dollar motion sensor alarms that are battery operated can be worth their weight in gold.

Another valuable tip is locking your metre box. A large proportion of offenders attempt to do this at the start of their offending.

Did you know over half of the burglaries occur whereby the offenders have got in through an open door or window.

Other useful tips include, installing quality security lighting, use quality deadlocks on doors and using key locks on windows, trim and clear trees and shrubs around your house so there is an unobstructed view, Photograph property, engrave property with your drivers licence number, install security screens on doors and windows and make sure you lock your sheds and vehicles.
