VEHICLE UPDATE REGISTER:



You are asked to complete all questions and return the form (and your dues) to the Secretary promptly.

NEWS FROM SOUTH AUSTRALIA:

Mike Cooke had a phone call from Neil Phillips of M.A.R.C. South Australia who advised that the 1986 NATIONAL RALLY was being sponsored by the South Australian Branch and would be held in the BAROSSA VALLEY during Easter of that year. Perhaps W.A. could really field a strong team if we started planning early - what about it !!!

Exhaust Manifold Gaskets:

The South Australians are looking into manufacturing gaskets to suit Model A exhaust manifolds. They will be made of copper/asbestos/copper. They propose



to sell them for \$5.50 a pair. If any of our members wish to purchase some would they advise Mike Cooke before mid September. Orders will be sent in one order and returned in one parcel for distribution. It sounds like good value so lets get behind it! Nothing ever gets cheaper in the restoration business, only dearer or harder to get.

CLUB SUBSCRIPTIONS:

For the past two years we have been able to contain our costs etc. within the \$5.00 p.a. However since then postage has risen to 27¢ for each newsletter and on one occasion a heavy issue cost us 35¢ a copy. Sure we have a little money in the bank and as most know, the physical bits and pieces of the newsletter come from voluntary donations, etc., but we want to organise some trophies and rally prizes in the coming twelve months so the suggestion is to increase subs to say \$7.00 per annum. CONCESSIONAL LICENSING REQUIREMENTS:

The following is an extract taken from the official letter from B.H. Larson, Chief Executive Office of R.T.A. stating requirements in regard to Concessional Licensing. We ask that all members read this and if it applies to your vehicle, please abide by it.

"" Before a veteran, vintage or post vintage motor vehicle may be licensed a letter from your club is required stating that the owner of the vehicle is a member of your organisation. The vehicle must be certified as being vintage, veteran or post vintage. The vehicle may be post vintage which will include vehicles manufactured after 1930 and before 1950.

The vehicle must be examined by one of the Authority's officers, or a certificate as to its roadworthiness produced, signed by the Club Vehicle Examiner.

Vehicles licensed under this concession will have the following conditions endorsed on the licence papers:

- 1. Daylight use only.
- 2. Vehicle to be used on the roads only on rallies or functions organised by the club, or when road testing in association with such a rally or function.

The Club must supply a special plate reading "Vintage Car" to be fitted in a position above the regulation number plate.

Vehicles manufactured after 1930 and before 1950 must be supplied with a special plate reading "Post Vintage" to be fitted in a position above the regulation number plate. ""

As we advised in our last newsletter, the Vintage / Post Vintage plates will cost members \$8.00 a pair.
