



## Installing Emergency Brake Lever Spring

The emergency brake lever spring is used to retract the emergency brake bands. Without proper installation of this spring the emergency brake bands will not fully retract, causing the brake bands to drag during normal operation. And yet, this is one of the most ignored and over looked items on the Model A. The reason is probably due to the confusion as to how they are to be installed. Like anything else, it's a simple task if you know how to do it.


There is a left spring and a right spring so the first task is to determine which one goes on the right side and which one on the left side. One end of the spring has a hook that will hook around the emergency brake lever arm. The other end of the spring is straight with a slight bend, and will rest against the service brake actuating arm shaft.

Letermine if the spring is left hand or right hand, set the springs upright, on the flat end opposite the hook. Position the spring so the hook and straight end are facing you.




If the hook is on the left side, it is a left wound spring and goes on the left brake lever. If the hook is on the right side of the spring, it goes on the right brake lever. Install the springs as shown and described below.

- 1. Remove the clevis pin and brake rod from the emergency brake lever arm.
- 2. Remove the emergency brake lever arm bolt (1/2" wrench) and lock washer. Slide the lever off the toggle shaft. Retain the woodruff key.



- 3. Place the spring on the shaft, with the straight end of the spring on the backing plate side and sticking up from the bottom of the shaft.
- 4. Rest the straight end of the spring on the service brake arm shaft, just in front of the emergency brake arm shaft. The hook end of the spring should be at the lever arm end of the shaft, with the open end of the hook facing the rear of the car.
- 5. Insert a #5 woodruff key on the toggle shaft and slide on the lever arm (There is a left hand and right hand lever arm. Look for LH or RH cast into the side of the arm). Insert the 5/16-24 bolt and lock washer (1/2" wrench) and firmly tighten.
- 6. Using the hook tool, pull the hook on the spring up and over the shaft, toward the front of the car, far enough forward to allow it to hook around the emergency brake lever arm. The spring action will pull the lever arm to the rear of the car.

#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE MODEL A RESTORERS CLUB OF WA

On the 22nd June, 2000 this interesting and family orientated club will have been in existence for a full twenty years. For those that originally started the sub branch of Western Australia, it must seem in some ways to have flown by. Unfortunately some of the inaugural members are no longer associated with the club, a few have passed away, and with the exception of two, the remainder we seldom see at club events. Of course circumstances change and people have personality clashes and life being what it is, interests wane.

Twelve families were present at the first meeting and elected a president and a secretary/treasurer. The annual subscription was set at \$5, plus being a branch of The Model A Restorers Club in Canberra (they forwarded money to get us started), an amount of \$12 would ensure the membership of the mother club. Everyone was encouraged to belong to both branches and I believe most did this.

At this stage the club members owned 17 Model A-s of which 7 were fully restored, equating to 41% ratio of restored to owned. The stats are probably about the same today.

The club was incorporated later in 1980 and by September that year there were 20 family memberships. The club has continued to grow with a few static times and a few boom years where a concentrated effort to recruit new memberships was encouraged.

The meetings were held at members' homes and while we now are guided by a monthly run that is organised by a volunteer, we generally still hold meetings in an informal atmosphere, whether it be in the park, at the venue where we are or in a club member's home. The inaugural run was held on Saturday, 2nd May, 1981, almost twelve months on from that first meeting. As part of our by-laws passed in 1990 it was decided to never cancel a run because of 'the weather' and to my knowledge we have stuck to that come rain, hail or shine.


At the AGM in August, 1982 we ceased to be a branch of the Canberra club and stepped away from their guiding hand, becoming a club in our own right, but still being affiliated with all other Model A Ford clubs in Australia.

The seventh National Meet in 1982 was attended by representative members of the WA club, although there were attendees from the West in 1978 at Canberra before the club was formed. Our club hosted its first National Meet in 1992, ten years on from Echuca in 1982. Our next challenge is in 2004.

Lots of people have come into the club's life, stayed, made a difference, and then left. Others have visited briefly, never contributed and silently slipped away. On the other hand we have members who joined very early in the club's life strongly supported the club still do so and those who we have never seen, the only contact is that yearly subs cheque.

The idea behind the 20th Anniversary Picnic was to invite all those who had been a part of the Model A Restorers Club across the twenty years to a reunion, but despite all the hard work by Pat Bussard and some mighty detective work by Toni Mahony, we did not have one past member attend.

On the 30th January we gave a minute's silence to remember those deceased club members. To all past and current members we salute you and thank you for all the work that has contributed to make the Model A Restorers Club what it is today.

Against all odds she inspired a sense of unity amongst both existing members and new recruits. Sylvia has lead numerous land searches as Operations Manager, performed as Operations Officer during floods, taken on the role of Operations Manager during severe storms, assisted in sea search operations as a Staff Officer, provided support as a Logistics Officer during bush fires, acted as a Communications Officer during SES emergencies and provided logistics support for the catering of food and water for emergency service colleagues. In addition, Sylvia has supported the Police Service with murder investigations and arson investigations. A Life Member of the SES Northam District, Sylvia has been an active member of a number of committees for many years, including the Local Emergency Management Committee and the SES Volunteer Consultative Committee where she represented volunteers at a State level. Sylvia was also instrumental in gaining support and procuring funds for the new Northam SES Unit headquarters, a mammoth project in itself.
