

Business Arising: H. Hurij – Request for an extra examination day for those who were unable to attend on the official day. Hans to contact S. Read.





Moved J. Laurie, seconded A. Jeffree the Financial Report be accepted. Carried. General Business: Easter 2001: A. Jeffree advised that the Easter trip to Kirup is on for next year. November Run: B & G Guest asked for a volunteer to organise the November run - J. Laurie has offered to take over. Christmas Dinner 2000: T. Mahony advised our Christmas Dinner is booked for 10 Dec, for 12 noon. Entertainment has been organised for an hour after dinner. D. Annear will be handling bookings from October. The cost per head will be \$20-\$25 for the meal, with drinks to be paid for on the day individually. Acceptable Modifications for Model A-s: Considerable discussion was had on this subject with regard to what the Dept of Transport would allow for concessionally licensed vehicles. It was moved by C. Davidson that the vehicle examination team of S Read, R. Blewett, M. Annear and R. Mahony have a meeting to discuss this issue and for the President and S. 

Everyone appeared to enjoy their day and my thanks to them all for coming and making it a success. *Chris Butler*



Examination Requirements

As all club members are aware, it is a club requirement that all club cars are examined annually whether on full or concessional licence. The Department of Transport requires a report on concessional licenced which have not been examined by this club or another authorised club forwarded to us by July 15. If your car is examined by another club you must forward a copy of the examination report to our Club Examiner by 13 July to avoid the Department of Transport having contradictory reports by clubs. As the annual examination rule is on the joining form for our club nobody has a reason to be unaware of this rule. [S Read] Our main examination day has been the day of our AGM which is held in late July. As a little leeway in time is usually given by the Department, we have been able to forward our report soon after the AGM without problems. However there are some vehicles which have not been examined by our club and we have not been notified that they have been examined by another club. These have been included in our report for this year. If you know you will be unable to present your car for examination on the AGM day, you MUST contact our vehicle examination team preferably a month or two PRIOR to the AGM to make arrangements for an examination prior to the AGM. This can be carried out at a regular monthly run or at some other place convenient to you and the club examiners.

THE AGM WILL BE THE <u>FINAL</u> DAY FOR EXAMINATIONS EACH YEAR to avoid any conflict with the Department of Transport. Newly restored vehicles may be examined at any time during the year. As this method of licensing is a privilege-extended to motoring enthusiasts and as we are lucky enough to have our own Authorised Inspection Station standing and examiners, I feel it is something we should take seriously. *Toni Mahony, Secretary*.





IGNITION COIL POLARITY CHECK TEST

In answer to a request on how to check if a Model A Ford ignition coil was correctly wired Mr Bob Bidonde kindly provided this drawing. There is some confusion over ignition coils wiring due to the following factors:



1. There was a wiring change made in 1929 to bring the ammeter into the ignition circuit. This is a very good idea as coil current flow will show on the cabin ammmeter indicating that power is going to the coil via the ignition switch when the switch is ON. The wiring change will also reveals a short circuit due to a faulty coil, bad Electrolock cable, stuck points and a faulty capacitor.

The modification required changes to the terminal box wiring causing confusion over where the ignition coil wires should be connected.

- 2. Ignition coils do not necessarily have + or markings on them.
- 3. The coil will work wired either way althoug 1 it is much more efficient when wired correctly.

Coil polarity is determined by watching the the spark.

The spark jumps from the wire to the pencil if the coil polarity is correct.

Change wires to the ignition coil if the spark is on the wrong side.

<u>CAUTION</u> Pencils have a graphite core and can conduct shocking high voltages!
