





CLUB MEMBER PROFILES - Alex and Linda Kirkwood

Happy New Year to all! This month we have another foundation member sharing his story. Alex Kirkwood is still involved in the old car movement, although he and Linda have not been to a Model A Restorers Club gathering for many years. We hope this changes in the near future, as there are many newer members who would enjoy meeting them. Pat Bussard.

Names: Alex and Linda Kirkwood

First meeting attended: Prior to the club being formed, I attended a meeting organised by the late Eric Richards to see if there was sufficient interest to form a club.

How did you become involved? I attended the inaugural meeting at Bill Bennie's home. I have always had an intense interest in Model A-s and being a member of the *Veteran Car Club of WA (Inc)* (joined 1972), I was aware of the interest in forming a local Model A club. At that time, I was also a member of the Canberra based *Model A Restorers Club* and the *Model A Ford Club of America*.

National and International Meets attended: Attended the Perth National meeting in 1992. Memorable club events: Linda and I organised the first club rally to John Forrest National Park on Saturday, May 2, 1981. Seven member families and one non-member attended in their Model A-s. We were then invited to run a re-enactment rally using the same route sheet 10 years later on May 5 1991. Other club events that we have enjoyed have included a trip to Leeman at Easter 1991 and to Kirup for one Easter trip.

Family and personal history: Linda was born in India to English parents and moved to Perth when 9 years old. I was born in Kalgoorlie as were both my parents.

My father owned a 1928 Model A ute which he had purchased for £25 some 6 years before I was born in 1946. From an early age I became very passionate about the A. At age 12 I learnt to drive "Lizzie" and by the time license time arrived, I was an experienced bush driver...but things were a little different in the 60s. At age 16 while holidaying in Perth, I purchased a Floyd Clymer publication titled "How to Restore The Model A Ford" from Alberts Book Shop in Forrest Place...and at that time a restoration seed for the future was sown.

At that time I began to "tidy" the ute which included painting the engine green and painting the front and rear axles silver...which was the "in" thing at the time.

For my Leaving Certificate (TEE) Mechanical Drawing Project, I prepared a series of drawings of a Model A engine. The scales were taken from the above-mentioned book together with an old block that I had picked up.

In terms of employment, Linda is an Administrative Assistant at Alcoa World Alumina where she is in her third stint with this company. Initially leaving after some 8 years service to start a family, returning part way through the family process for a short while and then returning for the final segment some 14 years ago. Alcoa is a very special place for us both as we met there in 1965. I am an Accountant by profession and am currently General Manager, Finance and Resource Management at the Department of Health.

Linda and I have been married for 33 years and have 3 boys aged 30, 28 and 24, together with 3 grandchildren.

Only our oldest son (Jay) has an interest in cars, but not so much the older cars. But that may change over time ...and there is hope with the grandchildren. From an early age, Jay was always in the workshop with me and when he was 17 he took the A on a club run with some friends. I did not hesitate to allow him to do this as he had grown up with the car and treated it with absolute respect. What music do you listen to? We both enjoy all modern music and the radio is always on in the house and cars. I also enjoy David Bowie music.

The most memorable concert(s) you have attended. Saltimbanco. Always enjoy John Farnham concerts.

Sporting interests: We are Eagles members and attend each game although we enjoy watching all

sports. Linda in particular enjoys netball, and while I enjoy the usual football and cricket, I am passionate about all forms of motor sport.

Other interests: Linda enjoys craft work as a hobby and we both enjoy gardening.

Our Model A: Our Model A is an AR phaeton (CA4485) which was purchased from the original owner (Mr Jack Fenn of Cottesloe) in March 1972 for the sum of \$212.50. Jack was 90 years old and both he and the vehicle had just been de-registered. After obtaining a police permit, I drove the A home, but not before Jack checked the oil and water and supervised the warm-up. Sadly he passed away before I finished the restoration.

This vehicle was the only one that Jack owned during his life and he purchased it from Fremantle Ford dealers McCullock and Neil Ltd. It was registered in Fremantle on 25 October 1928 with the number 19578.

Whilst the vehicle appeared reasonable, it needed a total restoration including the woodwork and this took place over 2½ years concluding in November 1974 when we attended the VCC Mandurah rally. In the initial years we were successful in concourse events with the A winning Car of the Year with the VCC and probably its best outcome was in 1979 when we missed out by half of a point of being the outright winner of the Combined Car Club concourse.

The car is painted Gunmetal Blue and is fitted with whitewalls. Whilst not my first choice, there was a tyre shortage in 1974 and I could only get whitewalls, but it grew on me over time. All cars must have a name and the A is named Syd.

Other Restorations: On completing the A, I began gathering bits for a 1915 brass radiator Model T. In 1975 I was able to acquire a bent and broken chassis, together with a range of hard-to-find items such as a block with a 1915 casting date (date cast in side of block), brass top steering column, sump and diff casing. This was the start of a long project requiring many trips to some very remote places.

Over 10 years this vehicle has been hand built including the full wooden frame, the body and full mechanicals. The block for example had been in the weather for many years and to retrieve it required boring the cylinders to the max and then sleeving. The valve seats were machined out and fitted with inserts, again as a result of exposure to the weather and this was the story as progression was made through the parts that I had gathered. To undertake a lot of this work, I purchased a Myford ML7 lathe and that proved to be invaluable. We still have the Model T.

I then progressed to restore our 1970 Twin Cam Escort (Lotus) which we have owned since 1974. This vehicle was passed to son Jay who adopted the philosophy of "drive it until the road wears out". The Escort is now back home and awaits another tidy-up.

Next project was to fully rebuild an EH Holden for son Ric. This vehicle started life as a rusty shell without mechanicals and over $2\frac{1}{2}$ years was transformed into a lowered beast with disc brakes, 5 speed Toyota Supra gearbox and a very modified Holden 202 engine.

Next came the full restoration of a 1973 MGB.

Current Project: The current project is a 1952 Jaguar XK120 Fixed Head Coupe.

The XK was imported from California and to purchase this was the realisation of a boyhood dream. Whilst I had an inspection carried out in the US and then I carefully examined photos, the vehicle bodywork was not as good as it appeared. But then in playing with old cars, that's life. I have undertaken extensive body work and am currently in the paint phase. The body will then be removed and then the mechanicals tackled.

Projects for when I retire include a Model A factory ute, together with a Ford V8 while I have a good roadster body, and tucked away is the remains of Dad's original ute.


