

Ford hails its Tassie survivor



Hundred up ... Francis Ransley's 1903 Model A Ford

As Ford prepares for its 100th birthday bash in June, it is turning Down Under to find the roots of its family tree.

That's because the oldest surviving Ford doesn't live at the company's headquarters in Detroit, but with an Australian collector in Tasmania.

Francis Ransley's 1903 Model A Ford has been confirmed as the oldest Ford in existence, after checks in America showed it pre-dates anything in the Ford museum. It was the 31st car to roll off Henry Ford's original production line, long before the famous Model T that hit the road in 1909.

"The significance of this car cannot be understated," says president of Ford Australia, Geoff Polites.

"There is every chance that Henry Ford himself helped build it. It's pretty much original right down to the muffler, which is the same one fitted to it at the factory in 1903."

The Model A wasn't Ford's first car but it was the first to be built on the production line he used to revolutionise car making after setting up business in June 1903.


Ransley's car was a late arrival in Australia. The Tasmania: bought it from an American owner in 1988. On arrival, he carried out a thorough restoration to return the car to the condition it was in when it left the Ford factory 100 years ago.

"We knew it was the oldest Ford in Australia, and wthought there was a chance that it could also be the oldest in the world," says Louise Teesdale of Ford Australia.


I received an email from Louise Read in which she made a very good point. Louise spoke to Robyn Clements (a former employee of Shannons) and Famous will match Shannons Insurance premium that we are now paying minus 10% discount or 13 months cover for the cost of 12 months. This sounds like a pretty good deal as she originally said the premium would be \$150 per car per annum. Because we have the car club covered by Famous for Public Liability it would be only fair to support them and insure the vehicles, however having said that, Shannons have always been very supportive of the old car movement and are sponsors of the National Meet in 2004. How do you divide your loyalties?

It was great to see Tom Eastough a member from Bindoon, who was driving past and saw all the Model A's and called in to say hello.

The most important publicity campaign of the Model "A" era centered around the Model "A" designated as the twenty-millionth Ford. This vehicle was assembled at the Rouge plant on April 14, 1931, and was driven off the final line by Henry Ford, with Edsel Ford in the front seat and manufacturing executives P. E. Martin and Charles E. Sorensen in the rear. Pictures were taken outside the plant and at Ford's home, Fair Lane, where the auto king's 1896 quadricycle was drawn up alongside the newest of the Company's milestone vehicles.


Ford Twenty Million was taken on a grand tour of the United States, being driven to New York, then to the West Coast, the southwest and south, and back to Dearborn. Most states assigned license number 20,000,000 to the vehicle, and hundreds of governors, mayors, and other dignitaries signed its log book. Along the way the car was driven by Eleanor Roosevelt (whose husband was then New York's governor), received the checkered flag at the Indianapolis Speedway, was inducted into the Sioux tribe, was chauffeured by Douglas Fairbanks in Los Angeles' 150th birthday parade, became the first privately-owned car to descend to the bottom of Hoover Dam, and was branded and draped with rattlesnake skins in Texas. The car returned to Dearborn, according to the Ford Times, to join other milestone Fords. But it has not survived.

Films on the Model "A" and how the car was made were viewed by millions of people at dealerships and in theaters. Ford was one of the first companies to produce sales-promotion films with sound, recording the dialog on discs in as

many as sixteen languages. Ford's "talkies" were widely circulated until 1931, when their novelty wore off.

Mr Smith's car was nice and bright. We liked the colour of Mr Ward's utility. Mr Hall had covers on his headlamps.




