

SERVICE INFORMATION

Side Wheel Carrier Adjustment

Many restorers desire the appearance of the fender well and side sheel spare tire carrier. If not properly installed, these assemblies can cause considerable rattle. Following are some tips from the service manual.

Never bolt a spare wheel to a side wheel carrier without first making certain that the wheel is seated all the way down in the fender well. If the spare wheel is not all the way down in the fender well, vibration or an annoying rattle often develops.

The position of the wheel in the fender well can be easily adjusted as the elongated slot in the A-1402 R.H. and A-1406 L.H. spare wheel carrier flange assemblies permits moving the wheel either up or down. (See Fig. 1).

To obtain the correct adjustment, first mount the wheel on the side carrier and tighten the A-21894 flange nut just tight enough so that a slight drag will be felt when the wheel is raised or lowered. Next press the wheel all the way down into the fender well, then carefully remove the wheel so as not to disturb adjustment of carrier plate. After removing wheel securely tighten the A-21894 flange nut and remount wheel.





One or two instances have been noted where difficulty was experienced in removing spare wheel from side carrier. In checking this it was found that a right hand flange or plate had been assembled on the left side of the car and vice versa. When this is done due to the angle of the adjusting slot in the flange it is difficult to remove the wheel from the carrier.

There is no excuse for assembling these flanges incorrectly as the right hand flanges A-1402 are stamped "R" and must be assembled to side carrier arm on right side of car. The left hand flanges A-1406-B are stamped "L" and must be assembled on left side of car.

When correctly installed the narrow end of flanges will be slanting towards rear of car as shown in Fig. 2.
