MINUTES OF MEETING OF M.A.R.C. (WA) INC. HELD AT HIND'S RESERVE ON SUNDAY, OCTOBER 26th, 1986.

The meeting was opened by M. MINUTES of the previous meeting held 17th August were read and confirmed as a correct record. Moved S. Read 2nd B. Spencer.

A suggestion was made that to raise some funds for the 1990 Rally perhaps


