

ACROSS AUSTRALIA IN A MODEL A TRUCK (PART 1)

Well we are home at last, (I started this seven weeks ago) in one piece, just, after attending first, the Castrol Australian Bicentennial World Rally in Canberra then down to Geelong for about five days with friends before heading off to Wangarratta for the Easter weekend National Model A Rally.

We thoroughly enjoyed ourselves, especially on the trip across to the Canberra Rally and then at Wangarratta, which was a well organised busy long weekend. We saw quite a bit of Victoria in the process, although at a slow pace.

From Wangarratta after Easter we headed for Sydney via Yarrawonga, Wagga Wagga, Young, Cowra, Bathurst and Lithgow, this was a lovely leisurely drive although it rained occasionally. Some where before Lithgow a bit of dirt lodged in the idling jet of the carburettor, the first attempt to find it failed, so we pushed on. All the way down the Blue Mountains and to the outshirts of Sydney the truck back-fired and would not idle whenever I slowed down. Finally at the Bass Hill Caravan Park I found the offending piece of rubbish in the top half of the carburettor and everything was alright from then on.

We arrived in Sydney on the second last day of a very wet spell they had. Visibility coming down from Lithgow and Katoomba etc, was about 150 yards - terrible conditions and no chance of appreciating any views that may have been there.

We toured and looked around Sydney for four days, by train, bus and harbour cruises etc, before heading north via East Coast Antique Auto Parts to get a gasket set for the impending repairs at Ipswich. I was not happy with the compression on 2 cylinders, they felt weaker when the motor was cranked over by hand, of course the reproduction water pump shaft was another worry. Of course we had a hell of a vibration, but that cannot be found to this date, more on that when we do find the cause.

We drove up the old coastal highway to Gosford where we saw another local "A" with its owners and had a session looking over and talking about each others vehicle as usually always happens. Just after Gosford we had a flat tyre, caused by the very sharp bead on the new tyres chaffing into the tube. I forgot to mention, the first two blade fan broke just north of Sydney, after about 5480 miles, the cracked half was broken off and the good side sawn off for balance, of course the truck boiled, from here on most of the time, it is a very hilly road and we were about $2\frac{1}{2}$ tons all up. Next day with the mileage at 5500 the spare fan was put on, it too broke after only 58 miles, by this time we were at Taree so we stayed on extra day and purchased a Holden fan blade and had it welded onto the old hub, this worked perfect and is still fitted. The troublesome shaft was also replaced with a new stainless one I was carrying.

We carried on up the coast, keeping as near to the coast as possible without backtracking. All the northern N.S.W. coast is beautiful, hilly, and every town has many very large expensive homes.

A week after leaving Sydney we arrived at our friends place near Ipswich Queensland. Here we pulled the head off and then took out the motor to try to find the cause of the vibration. The centre main bearing was shattered and blue, so the motor had to go in for a new set of mains and a rebalance in case the original balancing was not done properly.

We stayed in the Brisbane area for about four weeks in total, toured the Sunshine Coast and Gold Coast etc, with friends in their vehicles while the truck was operated on. When we finally got it going, it still vibrated, so my mate made and fitted a set of rubber engine mounts (Rear) while we loafed it at the Gold Coast for the weekend. The rubber mounts really did not help quieten it down.

Now we had wanted to see something of the Barrier Reef, so we took off for Gladstone and drove into the night late, and all next day and ended up at Yepoon (Rockhampton) to see the Reef. We went out to Great Kepple Island for the day and then left for the return to Brisbane. Again we drove late into the night and slept in the roadside rest bay before another full day at the wheel, before arriving in Brisbane city at Midnight, it was nice and quiet then, before returning to Ipswich at about two AM.

We spent a few more days with our friends and then left in the afternoon for the Gold Coast and booked into a Caravan Park near Dream World. The next day was spent at Dream World from opening time to closing time, this is well worth it and those of you going to Queensland in 1990 should take time to call in there. I was a little disappointed with Giltraps Auto Museum which is the Dream World grounds.

As we were running a little late due to the repairs etc at Ipswich we just drove down Highway 1 to Sydney. Just after Dream World the eldest girl got a piece of paint or something in here eye, so we had to look for a doctor, we spent a whole day deviating into Hawksnest and Tea Garden just above Newcastle seeking medical attention, also as we came down the very hilly stretch north of Buleadelah the generator stopped working again, usually it was just broken field wires and a little patch up with the small soldering iron I carried was enough, but this time the solder had been thrown out of the commutator - to this day I cannot explain how that occurred, anyhow the Doctor at Tea Garden put us onto his Auto Electrician at Raymond Terrace and he soldered it up for \$10. My iron was not big enough for that job. One thing about the A, without a generator you can drive for more than one day even starting it with the starter 5-6 times and the standard battery holds up well.

We stayed overnight at Raymond Terrace this time in an on-site van because it rained. The next morning we continued on towards Sydney calling into Gosford again, to look up a lead on a reported 1910 Ford T carburettor, it turned out to be a 1926-27 plate vapouriser (Holly) so we gained no extra weight at that step. So after a short discussion, about mainly the weather and the damage caused by the recent rains (floods etc) eg. the house at the back of these people, on the side of a hill was washed 17 feet sideways into the boundary fence.

It was now mid afternoon, so we drove onto the new (toll way) freeway towards Sydney to arrive on the outskirts in the peak hour rush at dusk, we refuelled and pushed on across the harbour bridge on the eastern lane on the outside, this gave the girls a good view of the lights, harbour and Opera House etc, we followed the Cahill Expressway under the park to the east of the city and on down under the airstrip and down to Wollongong for the night.

We went down the Bulli Pass, actually quite hair raising in the dark, with not the brightest of headlights and warning signs explaining a 1 in 6 slope, can't place having seen that before or since.


