



Sarah Tapper was the daughter of **DANIEL TAPPER** and **ANN NORRIS**.

Sarah was born on 16 Aug 1830, Clarence, Swan River Colony, Western Australia. This is just 3 months after her parents, Daniel and Ann, arrived in Western Australia on board the ship "Rockingham". The ship floundered in heavy weather and the passengers had to jump overboard and head for the shore. This must have been an extremely difficult time for Ann as she was 6 months pregnant.

Sarah was baptised at Fremantle on 2 Jan 1836. Baptised on the same day as her brother, John Tapper.

Sarah is noted as born in Clarence. Parent Daniel & Ann Tapper. Daniel's profession is recorded as Fisherman.


There is very little known of Sarah's early life in the colony but we know her family and her father in particular struggled to find employment and was at times unable to feed his family. Daniel and Ann had applied to join the immigrants in the Peel Estate scheme organised by Thomas Peel. This was a failure as the land around the Clarence area was totally unsuited to cultivation.

Sarah married on 1 Aug 1848 at St George's Church, Perth by Licence to **William Rewell**.

On 1 August 1848 Sarah Tapper aged 18 (she was not quite 18 DOB 16 August 1830 at Clarence settlement site) married William Rewell aged 22 at St George's Church by licence. They were both shown as resident in Perth, William was a Boatman, Sarah a Domestic Servant. William's father's name and Occupation were George Rewell, Gardener, Sarah's father and occupation are blank.

William was born c1825, the son of **George Rewell** and **Jane Parnham**. William and his parents arrived in the Swan River Colony on 12 Oct 1829 on board the ship "Caroline". William was the eldest of 7 children. His occupation in Western Australia was a Boat owner in 1862, Victualler of the "Rockingham Hotel" in 1867 and a fisherman. William was also a Water Policeman.

Sarah Rewell (nee Tapper) died 19 Oct 1899 at her residence in Harper Terrace, South Perth. She is buried in Karrakatta Cemetery, Western Australia.

**MRS. REWELL.**

It is with regret we announce the death of another old colonist in the person of Mrs. William Rewell, which took place at her residence, Hayser Terrace, South Perth, on October 19. The deceased lady was a daughter of Mr. Daniel Tapper, who arrived here in the year 1829. She was born at Clarence, on the Rockingham coast, shortly after her parents' arrival, and was therefore one of the oldest of West Australian pioneers. She was married to Mr. William Rewell, eldest son of Mr. George Rewell, who was also one of the earliest settlers. Mrs. Rewell was beloved by a large circle of friends, and was 70 years of age at her death. The funeral took place on Saturday afternoon at the Karrakatta cemetery, and was largely attended. The Rev. Mr. Reid, Presbyterian clergyman, officiated at the grave. The pall-bearers were Mr. G. Randell, M.L.C.; Mr. H. Strickland, sen.; Mr. W. Strickland, sen.; and Mr. C. Stephens. The chief mourners were Mr. Wm. Rewell (husband of deceased), and Messrs. Fred. and William Rewell (sons). Wreaths were sent by numerous friends. Mr. M. O'Dea carried out the mortuary arrangements for Messrs. Bowra and O'Dea.



William married 2<sup>nd</sup> in 1903, Perth, WA to **SUSAN ROPER**.  
William Rewell died on 27 Apr 1922 at his residence in Harper Terrace, South Perth, Western Australia.

## CHILDREN OF SARAH & WILLIAM REWELL

**WILLIAM THOMAS REWELL** b. c 1850, baptised 18 Jun 1850, Perth, WA. It is believed that William Thomas Rewell died c1851 but no death registration or burial record has been located.

**LUCY REWELL** b. 13 May 1852, Perth, WA, d. 16 Nov 1908. Lucy is buried in Karrakatta Cemetery, WA. She married 1874 in Perth to **CHRISTOPHER ARMSTRONG**. Christopher died on 29 Mar 1928 and is also buried in Karrakatta Cemetery.

**FREDERICK THOMAS REWELL** b. 11 Oct 1855, baptised 25 Nov 1855, Perth, WA, died on 7 Jan 1946 and buried in Karrakatta Cemetery. Frederick was a fisherman and lived most of his life with his family at Harper Terrace, South Perth. In 1937 and 1943 the Electoral Rolls have Frederick living in an Old Men's Home in Claremont.

**JANE REWELL** b. 18 Oct 1859, d. 24 Dec 1931, buried in Karrakatta Cemetery. Married 1<sup>st</sup> 15 Jan 1885 to **JOHN RYDING**. John Ryding died on 20 Jul 1898 and was buried on 21 Jul 1898 at East Perth Cemetery. Jane married 2<sup>nd</sup> 1905 to **WALTER De COURCY ROCKLEY TURNER**.

**FANNY REWELL** b. 1861, Perth, WA, d. 1952. Married 9 May 1883 1<sup>st</sup> **FRANCIS EDWARD FISHWICK**. In 1891 the family were living in Broken Hill. Francis died in 12 Apr 1912, Johannesburg, South Africa. Fanny married 2<sup>nd</sup> **ROBERT JAMES HOLLAND**, in Perth in 1922. Fanny died 5 Apr 1952 at Mt Lawley and Robert died 27 Jan 1952. Both buried Karrakatta Cemetery.

**ALICE MAUD REWELL** b. 21 Jun 1863, d. 1954. Married 1884 in Guildford, WA to **LEWIS VINCENT BREENON**. Lewis Breenon had been employed as a Draughtsman in the Government Survey Department until 1884 when he charged with an offence, found guilty and jailed for 6 months. He was released from prison in August 1884. When Alice married on the 10 Sep 1884 at St Matthew's Church, Guildford, WA she was actually marrying **WILLIAM GOODWIN GEDDES**.

William was born on 15 Feb 1856 in Brisbane, Qld. Another story. The Geddes Mystery by Brian Jones.

Alice married 2<sup>nd</sup> on 11 Nov 1897 at St Mary's Cathedral, Perth WA to **BARTHOLOMEW JAMES STUBBS**. Bartholomew was born on 3 May 1872, Victoria, Australia. He was a Member of Parliament in Western Australia. Bartholomew enlisted in the AIF during WW1 but he was killed in action at Polygon Wood, Ypres, Belgium on 26 Sep 1917.

**GEORGE REWELL** b. 1865, d. 1865. Buried East Perth Cemetery.

**WILLIAM THOMAS REWELL** b. 19 May 1866, baptised 2 Aug 1866, Perth WA. William d. 29 Feb 1928. Married 1892 in Perth WA to **ELLEN (NELLIE) MARY EYLES**. William an ex-constable died as a result of an accident when he was run down by a motor vehicle.

**SARAH ANNE REWELL** b. 12 Mar 1869, Fremantle, WA, d. 27 Sep 1905. Sarah gave birth in 1892 to a daughter, **ADA MAY LLEWELLYN**. The father of Ada was **William Black Llewellyn** who had promised marriage to Sarah and he was summoned to court but failed to appear. (Inquirer & Commercial News, May, 1892). Ada Rewell/Llewellyn died in 1889 at age 2 months

**ADA MAUDE REWELL** b. 1872, d. 1953, Toorak, Victoria. Ada trained as a Nurse and in 1890 until 1895 she was employed at the Colonial Hospital, Perth WA. Ada married in 1896, Perth WA to **SIDNEY MARSHALL STANSMORE**. Sidney died in Melbourne, Vic in 1920.
